this place, with two of the Bishop of strasburghs Trumpetters, who it seems, immediately took out their pistols, and discharged them upon the Soldiers, and they failing, drew their Swords; the Soldiers in the mean time defending themselves bravely, wounded one of them, and left the other for de ad upon the place, and thereupon retired hither; this made much noise here among the common people, who are already sufficiently incensed against the Domesticks of that Bishop. Our Fortifications begin now to advance apace.

Bruffels, August 14. On Munday last his cellency the Count de Monterey came to Dixmon to 1 Bruges, and the next morning went thence

Bruges, and the next morning went thence in towards Iper; it is said, his Excellence will so now wist Artois, but intends to return very suddainly hither again, contrary to his former refolution, What may have creationed this change; of mind is not known, though some think, it may be to meet the Baron d'Isola, who together with several Deputies of the States, is coming in ther from the Hague.

We are told, that his Excellency is much difsatisfied with the new Governor of the Franche Comte, Don Hieronimo Quinones, who it seems, pretends to be independent, and to receive orders and instructions from the Queen Regent onely; whereupon, his Excellency hath dispatcht a Courier to Madrid, to know her Majesties pleasure in

the matter.

Here hath been some days since sent from hence to the Hague, 20 thousand Crowns, for the paying the Debts of the deceased Spanish Ambassador Don Estevan de Gamarra. It is reported that his Excellency is giving out Commissions for the raiging of 8 Regiments of Foot in Germany, and that the respective commands will be given to the Nobility of these Countries, of whom several are already named, at least in the common discourse of the Town. His Excellency hath given order for the making of Coats, for the cloathing the Walloon Regiments, in the same manner as the Spanish are: The Fortifications as well of this place, as of Ghent, Ostend, and other places go on space, to the great satisfaction of the Inhabitants.

Paris, August 15. The Deputies which were said to have come from Liste, Tournay, and the other late conquered places, to endeavor the obtaining the revocation of a late Edict, for the sorbidding the use of all Spanish Monles, except Pistols in those places, are gone to Fontainebleau, where his Majesty at present is, to sollicite that affair, in which they are extraordinarily earnest, as being a thing on which they pretend their Trade

doth very much depend.

The Count de Coning smark, hath received, as is said, the Monies allotted him by the King, for the raising of the two Regiments of Horse in Germany, to consist of 12 Troops each, which he is to command. We are told here, of a new Alliance lately made between the Duke of Savoy, and the

Catholick Cantons of Swifferland.

From Rochel they write, that they had advice there from Lisbon, that the Prince Regent had been so feesibly troubled at their not being able to discover the Authors of the Sacriledge, committed some time since, as was thought, by four Jews, in the stealing away the Hostie, that he was about resolving to have them all banished that Kingdom. And, that the Sieur St. Romain, Ambassador there from this Crown was on his deputture thence, expecting ally the arrival of the out l'Elecs Sqiad on ou wich g es the Ditch sof Cidivil, which ha crd retorn portlim hither

Hague, August 16. The States of Holland are still allembled, though in the inverim some of those Deputies are gone home to consult their Principals, concerning the matters at present in debate, but so, as to be back again about the beginning of the next week. On Saturday last the States of Holland were in Body in the Assumbly of the States General, to confer with them, as is said, about several weighty assairs.

The Rieds Pensionaris of Textual, together with the other Deputies of that Province, are still here, and have frequent conferences with those of the States General; in the mean time we hear not of any thing concluded on in the matter of the prohibition of French wines, &c. This morning the Velt Marshal Wurtz went hence for utrecht, intending to be back here again on Wednesday

To morrow or next day will be conveyed hence the Body of the deceased Ambassador, Don Estenante Gamurra for Byussels or Ghent, in order to its enterment there.

Antwerp, August 17. Our Governor the Count de Monterey, having visited Bruges, Ostend, and Nieuport, where he found every thing to his great content and satisfaction, is gone for Iper, where it is said, his Excellency has intentions to make several new Works and Fortistications. Here hath been lately sent heree several Canon to Mechelen to be there new cast for the service of this place.

We are told, of our Magistrates being about to lay a new Imposition on Wines, which is to be a Stuyver on every Can, towards the publick charge of the Government. Concerning the affairs of Cologne, we as yet hear but of little likelyhood of an accommodation.

Paris, August 19. Their Majesties are still ar Fontainbleau, but are expected from thence about 8 days hence at Versailles. We are told, that the Archbishop of Tholause late Ambassador in Spaine is made great Almoner to the Queen. The Process against the Sieur Mondevergue goes on very warmely, though it is believed, he may not be found so criminal as was at first imagined.
