##### ROAD TRAFFIC REGULATION ACT 1984

##### THE LEWISHAM (PRESCRIBED ROUTES) (NO. 4) TRAFFIC ORDER 2011

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that Lewisham Council made this order under the provisions of section 6 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 on the 2 September 2011. The order comes into force on the 19 September 2011.

1. The general nature and effect of the order is to—

(a) make Ryecroft Road no entry for motor vehicles from Hither Green Lane, while the road remains two-way working; and  
(b) provide for pedal cycle entry from Hither Green Lane on the north side of traffic island site in Ryecroft Road at the junction.

2. Exemptions from the control are also ambulance, fire brigade and police vehicles in an emergency and anything done with the permission or at the direction of a police constable in uniform.

3. Documents giving more detailed particulars of the order and measures can be inspected during normal office hours on Mondays to Fridays at the office of Lewisham Highways Development, Wearside Service Centre (Door-to-door Building), Wearside Road, Ladywell, London, SE13 (tel. 020-8314 2265).

4. Any person wishing to question the validity of the order or of any of its provisions on the grounds that it or they are not within the powers conferred by the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 or that any requirement of that Act or of any instrument or relevant regulation made under the Act has not been complied with may, within 6 weeks from the date on which the order was made, apply for the purpose to the High Court.

##### THE BEXLEY (PARKING PLACES) (DISABLED PERSONS)(AMENDMENT NO.) TRAFFIC ORDER 20XX

##### THE BEXLEY (NEW ELTHAM) (PARKING PLACES)(AMENDMENT NO..) TRAFFIC ORDER 20XX

1. NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the Council of the London Borough of Bexley propose to make the above mentioned Orders under sections 6, 45, 46, 49, and 124 of and Part IV of Schedule 9 to the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, as amended by Section 8 of and Part 1 of Schedule 5 to the Local Government Act 1985.

2. The general effect of the Bexley (Parking Places) (Disabled Persons)(Amendment No) Traffic Order 20XX would be to:

(a) designate parking places in which vehicles authorised by the Order may be left for a period during the permitted hours without charge in the roads specified in the Schedule to this Notice;

(b) provide that the parking place will operate at any time throughout the week;

(c) specify, in respect of the parking places in the roads in the Schedule, that disabled persons' vehicles displaying in the relevant position a disabled person's badge (commonly referred to as "the Blue Badge") issued by any local authority under the provisions of the Disabled Persons (Badges for Motor Vehicles) Regulations 1982, may be left therein;

(d) provide that certain vehicles may wait in the parking places in certain circumstances, e.g. to allow persons to board or alight (maximum 2 minutes), to load or unload (maximum 20 minutes), etc.,  
(e) revoke the existing parking places, 21 Barnet Close, Erith; 33 Berwick Road, Welling; 12 Douglas Road, Welling; 9 Exeter Road, Welling; 5 Harcourt Road, Bexleyheath; 55 Kentish Road, Belvedere; and 4 Woodlands Road, Bexleyheath;

(f) replace the existing disabled parking bay in Darenth Road, Welling, to a single parking bay; and

(g) introduce new parking bays as set out in the Schedule below.

3. The general effect of the Bexley (New Eltham) (Parking Places) (Amendment No. ) Traffic Order 20XX would be raise the extents of

parking places due to the introduction of a disabled persons parking bay in Oakley Drive, New Eltham.

4. Copies of the proposed Orders, the Bexley (Parking Places) (Disabled Persons) Traffic Order 2010 (and the Orders that have amended that Order); the Bexley (New Eltham) (Parking Places) Traffic Order 2008 (and the Orders that have amended that Order); the Council's statement of reasons for proposing to make the Orders and a map which indicates the length of roads to which the Orders relate can be inspected during normal office hours on Mondays to Fridays inclusive, at the Contact Centre, Civic Offices, Bexleyheath, Kent DA6 7LB.

Any person desiring to object to the proposed Order(s) should send a statement in writing of their objections and the grounds thereof, to the London Borough of Bexley, Public Realm Management, Traffic and Parking Services, P.O. Box 323, Broadway, Bexleyheath, Kent DA6 9GQ within 21 days of the date of this Notice.

7. Persons objecting to the proposed Order(s) should be aware that in view of the Local Government (Access to Information) Act 1985 this Council would be legally obliged to make any comment received in response to this Notice, open to public inspection.

##### THE BEXLEY (PROHIBITION OF STOPPING OUTSIDE SCHOOLS) (AMENDMENT NO. 6) TRAFFIC ORDER 2011

1. NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the Council of the London Borough of Bexley on 5th September 2011 made the above mentioned Order under sections 6, and 124 of and Part IV of Schedule 9 to the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, as amended by Section 8 of and Part 1 of Schedule 5 to the Local Government Act 1985.

2. The general effect of the Bexley (Prohibition of Stopping Outside Schools) (Amendment No. 6) Traffic Order 2011 would be to further amend the Bexley (Prohibition of Stopping Outside Schools) Traffic Order 2010 number 2 so that:-

(a) Items numbers 117; 118; and 119 for Townley Road, Bexleyheath, in Schedule 1 to that Order are deleted; and

(b) item numbers 175; 176; and 177 in Schedule 2 to that Order, are added

the effect of the above will be to revise lengths of the school 'keep clear' restriction in Townley Road, Bexleyheath, due to the provision of a zebra crossing.

3. The general effect of the closure will be to revoke Order 2010 No. 19.
