Courier arrived here on the 29th past in the Morning from Spain, whereupon the Duke Regent, accompanied by the Cardinal du Bois, went into the King's Cabinet, and delivered to his Majesty a Packet, with a Letter from the Catholick King, expresfing his Satisfaction with the Choice his most Christian Majesty had made of the Infanta his Daughter for his Queen, and demanding Madamoiselle de Montpenfier in Marriage for the Prince of Astu-tias; to which his most Christian Maje-fly readily consented. The Packet con-tained two Pictures, which the King of Spain tent to his Majesty, the one of the Infanta, and the other of the Prince of Asturias. The next Day the Duke Regent received the Compliments upon the Marriage of his Daughter, from the Foreign Ministers at the Louvre, where there was a great Concourse of the Nobility and Persons of Distinction. It is faid the Duke of Chartres will conduct Madamoiselle de Montpensier, his Sister, to the Frontiers of Spain, and that he will be accompanied by the Marquess de Biron and the Marquess de la Farre. That Princess was born on the 11th of December, 1709: The Prince of Asturias was born on the 25th of August, The Reversion of the Employment the Dutchess of Vantadour has at present of Governess to the Children of the House of France, is given to the Princess de Soubize, the Princess of Rohan having declined it, by reason of her weakly Constitution: Tis said the Durchess of Bouffleurs will be made Dame d'Atour to the young Queen. Father Lallemand, a Jesuite at Amiens, is sent for to Court, in order as is said to be appointed Confessour to Madamoiselle de Montpensier. The Duke of St. Simon ! will fet out the x2th Instant for Madrid.

The Court has ordered 300000 Livres to be advanced to him, towards the Expences of his Journey; belides which he has taken up a confiderable Sum of Money from several Bankers of this City. He will be accompanied by his Son and his Nephew, and 12 Knights of the Order of St. Louis, besides 24 Officers of the Army, who are to attend him by the King's Orders, and who besides their Pay are to receive confiderable Gratifi-'Tis believed his Embassy will cations. not last above six Weeks, after which he will return home with the Infanta. The Abbot Brigault, who was put into the Baltille in the time of the Duke of Maine's Difgrace, was fet at Liberty a few Days ago. The India-Company will begin on the 12th of November next, to Yell at Nantes the Merchandizes brought by the three Ships which lately arrived at Port Louis from the Coast of The Cardinal du Bois has Cormandel. made his Visits of Geremony to all the Princes and Princesses of the Blood, and on the 7th Instant he will take the usual Oaths to the King in the Chapel of the Tuilleries. The Princess of Carignan was brought to Bed some Days ago of a Son, to whom the King is to be God-father, and the Queen of Sardinia Godmother. The Princess d'Auvergne, Sister ro the Duke of Aremberg is arrived here, and deligns, tis faid, to retire into a Convent. Count Sperling, a Swedish Gentleman of about 23 Years old, and who is Chamberlain to the King of Sweden, and has a confiderable Estate in that Country, is turned Roman Catholick, and made his Abjuration here on the 23d past with great Solemnity in the Church of the New Converts.

Hague, Oct. 3, N. S. The Marquels de Monteleone, Ambassadour of Spain, having some Days ago presented a Memorial to the States General, in which he desired that a trusty Person appointed by their High Mightinesses should be

from this Country to Spain, to take Care that the said Ships should not in their Voyage take in at any Port or in open Sea any French Goods which on Account of the Plague are forbidden to be imported into Spain; their High Mightinesses passed a Resolution the 1st Inflant,-to return for Answer to the Marquels, that his Propolition of appointing a Person to have such Care in every Ship of their Subjects bound for Spain, other than one belonging to the Ship, does not appear to them to be practicable; but that that they think it will serve to the same Purpose, to enjoyn by a solemn Oath the Master or Pilot of each Ship not to take on board any French Goods, either in Exchange for others at any Port of any Country, or from any Vessel at Sea; the Form of which Oath they are willing to concert with the Marquess. This Resolution has been signified to the said Marquess by one of their High Mightinesses Deputies.

Whitehall, Sept. 16, 1721.

Whereas the King of Spain hath established certain Regulations, the better to prevent the Contagion which rages in France from spreading it self into his Dominions, which Regulations the Ships of all Nations trading to Spain are made liable to; His Majesty is hereby pleased to direct, That publick Notice be given thereof to all Merchants and others His Subjects trading to any Purt of Spain, and to require, that, in order to prevent any Inconveniences or Losses which they may otherwise suffers, wiz. That the Master, Commander, or other Person taking Charge of every Ship, do, after clearing, take from the proper Officers of the Customs a Gertificate of the Lading. That each Ship do carry a Bill of Health from the chief Magistrates of the Port or Place of Lading. That the Master, Commander, or other Person taking Charge of each Ship, do, at his Arrival in any Port of Spain, declare upon Oath, being there required so to do, that the Voyage hath been directly pursued, that no Exchange hath been made of any Goods or Merchandize belonging to, or taken out of other Ships, and that the Ship did not anchor in any suspected Port during her Voyage.
