That the Master, Commander, or other Perfor ta-king Gharge of every Ship, do, after clearing, take from the proper Officers of the Customs a Gertificate of the Lading. That each Ship do carry a Bill of Health from the chief Magiftrates of the Port or Place of Lading. That the Master, Commander, or other Person taking Charge of each Ship, do, at his Arrival in any Port of Spain, declare upon Oath, being there required to to do, shat the Voyage bath been directly pursued, that no Exchange hath been made of any Goods or Merchandize belonging to, or taken out of other Ships, and that the Ship did not anchor in any fulfpected Port during her Voyage.
