HE Marriage concluded between the King of France and the Infanta of Spain was declared Yesterday at the Publick Rejoycings for Court at Balfain. this Marriage are now making here, and will be continued three Days fucceffively, as allo for the Arrival of the Spanish Flora from New Spain at Cadiz on the 18th Inftant, the News of which came hither this Day by Express, with Advice that the faid Foia has brought four Millions of Pieces of Eight for the King, and feven Millions for private Per-This News is the more agreeable to fons. the Court, because they were in great Appreheations for fome Days path, upon the Advite they had received that Nine Algerine Ships of 30 to 50 Guns were gone out of the Streights, in order, as was supposed, to intercept the faid Flota.

Berne, Off. 1. The Regency of this State refolved two Days ago, to forbid upon the fe ver ft Penalties all Communication with Lyons, the Lionnois, and all the Provinces Conti-guous for this last, and no Persons whatever are to be admitted into this Canton from that Side, without first taking an Oath upon the Frontier, that they did not come from or pais through, any Part of the Pro-vinces named in the Act of Prohibition. The like Declaration is to be mide upon Oath , by the Proprietors of all Goods that thall be brought into this Canton. A general Fast was observed the 18th of the last Month throughout the Protestant Cantons, pursuant to the Order of the last Assembly at Frawenfeld.

Paris, OH 8. The Marquels de la Farre, Cap tain of the Guards to the Duke of Orleans, is appointed to go to Madrid on the Part of his Royal Highness, to compliment the King and Queen of Spain upon the Mar-riage agreed on between the Prince of Aftutiss and Madamosfelle de Montpensier, and to deliver that Princels's Picture to the faid Prince of Aftufias. He will fet out on the 10th Inftant with the Duke of St. Simon, whole Equipage 15, getting ready with the utmost Diligence; tis faid the Count de St. Eftevan, bis C-tholick Majefty's firft Plenipotentiary at Cambray, will fhortly come hi-sher, and make a Demand in form of Ma damoifelle de Montpenfice for the Prince of Afturias. On the 4th Inftant the Duke of Brancas took. a ludden Refolution to retire info a Convent, and Ter out the fame Day with two Servants only for the Abbey of Bec Bet Normandy, where he has cholen to pals the Remainder of his Life in Solitude. Hhas given up all the Peofiuns he held from the Grown and out of his (wn Effate has re feiv d to himfelf only 6000 Livres per Annum before his Departure he waited on the Cardi-

nal du Bois, with whom he left a Letter for the-Duke Regent, in which he thanked his Royal Highnels for all the Favours he had shewn him, and recommended his Family to his Protection. The Abbot Vertor, famous for leveral excellent Books, died fome Days agos Pursuant to a Sentence given by the Commiffioners eftablished for examining Mr. William Law's Affairs, they began Yesterday to fell his Effects at Verfailles; ho humfelf continues Prisoner in Fort l'Eveque. In the last Affembly of the Sorbonne a Lettre de Cachet was read; containing in Subfrance, that the King being informed of the Intrigues that were carrying on amongst the Ductors of that Faculty for electing a new Syndick, his Majefty thought fit to put a Stop to them; forbidding any further Proceedings on that Head, and continuing M. Romigny in his Employment of Syndick. As for the Remonitrances that were prefented fome Time ago in the Name of the Faculty, his Majesty ex-pressed his Displeasure against those who had any Part therein, who are in the Lettre de Cachet retried Diffurbers of the Peace of the Faculty. After the reading of this Letter M. de Romigny made a Speech, tending to exhort the Doctors to an Agreement among themfelves; and then he proposed that Leave might be given to the Abbot of St. Albin, who had been named Coadjutor to the Bifhoprick of Laon, to take the Doctor's Cap, which was unantmoully agreed. The Bifhop of Laon died on the 5th Inftant in his Diocels, and the faid Abbot of St. Albin who had been named fome Time ago his Coadjutor; will of courfe fucceed him. M. de Brezons, Archbishop of Rohan, is dangeroufly ill. The Bp. of Frejus, the King's Preceptor, has accepted of the Abbey of St. Stephen of Caen, which is worth 35000 Livres a Year, and has given up in Exchange his Abbey of Tourans.

The following Regulations to be observed with regard to Paffengers and Goods bound from the Ports of London and Dover for Calais, having been transmitted by the proper Officer of that Place to the Agent of the Packet Boats at Dover, and by him to His Majefty's Postmaster General ; the same having been laid before His Majesty, are by His Majesty's Command made publick, for the necessary Information of all His Majesty's Subjetts whom it may in any wife concern.

Copy of the Regulations to be observed about the Contagion.

Article V. The Captain of the Key final give No-tice to all the Packet Boats and Traosport-Ships which go and return from Dover and London to this Port. and to the Wherries, not the give Paffage to any Perfon, of what Quality and Condition foever, not even to Couriers,

Couriers, unless they being with them Bills of Health figned by the Officers of the Towns from whence they come ; and in cafe the Ma Here of the Packet Boats, Transport Ships or Whereies, do bring Persons who are not furnished with Certificates of Health, the Town-Guard Ihall not fuffer the Persons or any Goods to be landed, but Ihall force them to resurn back upon the Penalties mentioned in the foregoing Article, which are, the Perfons to be shot, and the Ships and Cargoes to be burnt ; the Town-Boats shall also be forbidden to bring them on Shore, unlefe they fhall first have produced their Bills of Health to the Town.Guard.

Article VI.

As the Herring-Fishing brings into this Port great Numbers of Fishing-Boats to fish there, the Master of the Key is to give Notice from Week to Week, that none of them may pretend Ignorance, that they are forbidden up on Pain of Death to give Paffage to, or to take in at Sea, or on Shore, any Perlon, upon any Pretence whatloever, or to go on board any Ships coming from suspected Places.

That each Ship do carry a Bill of Health from the chief Magistrates of the Port or Place of Lading. That the Master, Commander, or other Person taking Charge of each Ship, do, at his Arrival in any Port of Spain, declare upon Oath, being there required to to do, spain, accure upon Ome, being there required to tao, that the Voyage bath been directly purfued, that no Ex-change bath been made of any Goods or Merchandize belonging to, or taken out of other Shift, and that the Ship did not anchor in any suspected Port during ber CARTERET.
