A PROCLAMATION,

For a Publick Fast.

GEORGE R.

W HERE AS several Parts beyond the Seas continue to be grievously afflitted with the Plague; we being deeply sensible of the unspeakable Miseries aur Subjects would suffer if our Dominions should be wifted with so fatal a Calamity; and putting our Confidence in Almighty God (who out of His irfinite Goodness and Mercy has often preserved these Nations from imminent Destruction) that upon our Humiliation and Repentance, He will not cease to be Gracious, but will wouch fafe His Bleffing to us and our People, by averting so severe a Judgment; have resolved, by the Advice of our Privy-Council, That a general and publick Fast be observed, that both we and our Subjects may humble ourselves before almighty God, and may, in a m st Devout and Solemn Manner, send up our Prayers to the Divine Maj-sly, to implore His Protection and Blessing, to avert all those Judgments which our manifold Sins have deserved, and to continue His Mercies, and to perpetuate the Enjoyment of the Protestant Religion among us, and Safety and Prosperity to our Kingdoms and Dominions: We have therefore thought fit, by the Advice of our Privy-Council, to issue this our Royal Proclamation, hereby appointing and commanding, that such General and publick Fast be observed throughout that Part of our Kingdom of Great Britain salled England, the Dominson of Wales, and the Town of Ber-wick upon Tweed, on Friday the Eighth Day of Decom-ber next. And for the better and more orderly Solemnizing the same, we have given Directions to the Archzing the same, we have given Directions to the Archbishops, and the Bishops of England, to compose a Form of Prayer suitable to this Occasion, to be used in all Churches and Chapels, and other Places of publick Worship, and to take Gare the same be timely dispersed throughout their respective Diverses. And we do strictly charge and command, that the said publick Fast be religiously observed by all our loving Subjects, as they tender the Favour of Almighty God, and upon Pain of suffering such Punishment as we may justly institute upon all such as shall contenue or neglect the Performance of so Riligious and Necessary a Duty. Religious and Necessary a Duty.

Given at our Court at St. James's, the Twenty third Day of October, 1721, in the Eighth Year of our Reign. God fave the KING.

Paris; Nov. 1. On the 29th past the Duke d'Ossuna arrived here in the Quality of Ambassadour Extraordinary from the King of Spain, and has since had a private Audience of the King and the Duke Regent. On the 28th past the Duke Regent was taken ill, but his Royal Highness is since very well recovered. The Duke d'Aumont is on the mending Hand; but M. de Memes, First President of the Parliament, is very ill at his Country Seat.
