From the 4th of September to the 23d of October 399 Perfons had died at Mende. The Diftemper in general is lefs violent at the Beginning and End of every Moon. There are no fick at Chambon, where are left only two Monks and yo fully obferved. Three Perfons died lately between Concoules and Genouilhac, in a Farm-Houfe inclu-ded within the Blockade of that Place.
