N the 10th Inftant the Court being at Balfaid received the agreeable News, that the Marriage of the Prince of Afturias with Madamosfelle de Monspenfier, fourth Daughter of the Duke of Orleans, had been deelared at Paris. Their Catholick Majeffies were complimented upon it by the chief Perfons of the Court, and that Night there was a Ball there a The next Day their Majefties went to Segovia, where in the Church of our Lady of Fuencilla, Te Deum was lung; and Illuminations with other publick Demonstrations of Joy were made in this City three Nights fucceflively on this Occasion. His Catholick Majefty has fince nominated the Officers of the Houfhold for the Prince of Acturias, and his Confort 5 those for the former are, the Duke of Popoli, the Conde de Altamira, the Conde de Santistevan, the Duke of Gandia, the Marquels de los Balbales, the Marquels del Surco, the Conde de Salateli, and the Conde de Arenales; for the latter, the Marquels de Valero now Viceroy of Mexico, the Marquels de Castel.Rodrigo, Dop Juan Pizarro de Arragon Son of the Marquels de San Juan, the Conde de Anguisola, the Dutchels of Mon-tellano, the Dutchels of Liria, the Marchionels de Torrecuío, and the Marchionels de Alentar, and for her Confessor Father Ignatius Laubrusel a Jesuite. His Majesty has also nominated the Marquels of Santa Cruz, to conduct the Queen of France to the Frontier and to receive there Madamoiselle de Montpensier ; and he is to have the Direction of their respective House. holds going and coming. Paris, Nov. 12. Madamoifelle de Montpenfier's Departure for Spain is fixed to the 17th Instant ; She will be 38 Days on the Road from hence to Bayonne, where the Infanta of Spain will arrive about the fame Day. The Prince of Rohan is named to conduct that Princels to the Frontiers of Spain, and to re-ceive the Infanta there : These two Princesses are to be carried in Chairs, where the Roads are bad. The 10th Inftant the Dutchels of Vantadour, together with the Princels Soubize, and the reft of the Ladies that are to go to meet the Infanta, went to the King to receive his Majefty's Commands; and on the 16th Inftant Madamoiselle de Monspensier will take het Leave of the King at the Tuilleries, and foon after bis Majefty will return her the Visit at the Palais Royal; and wish her a good Journey. The Duke d'Osfuna is removed to the Hôtel of Ambaffadours, where he will continue during his Stay here. His publick Audience is put off till To-Morrow, It seems the Diffis culties the Court of Spain had flarted, on Aci count of the Duke of St. Simon's Retinue following him into, Spain, because of the Ap-prehension of the Plague, are removed; and all Persons that attended the faid Duke have been allowed to follow him, together with all his Equipage. The Marquels de la Farre let out Lefterday Morning for Spain on the Part of the Duke Regent. The Plague has broke out at Alais in Languedoc; that Place has been fince blocked up by a fufficient Number of Troops. The Marquels de Brancas is to set out this Week, to take upon him the Command of the Troops in the Comtat. Orders are fent into all the Provinces to prohibit the Transportation of all forts of Merchandizes into fuch Countries as have interrupted Commerce with France on Account of the Plague. The Marshal Berwick has also caused an Ordonnance to be publifhed, prohibiting the Transportation of the Corn of Languedoc into any of the neighbour-ing Provinces, upon the Penalty of a Fine of 1000 Livres. Circular Letters have been fent by the Government to all the Counfellours of the Parliament of Paris, fummoning them to be in Town on the 19th Instant, in order to deliberate upon Matters of great Importance
