THE Great Council of Two Hundred being assembled on the 7th Instant to dispose of the Dignities of Chief Advoyer and Secret Counsellour of this State, vacant by the Decease of M. Frisching; and the Competitors for the former being four, who were the Chief Officers of this Canton, next the Chair, the Election by Balloting fell upon M. d'Erac Treasurer of this Canton, by a great Majority: And M. Frisching Son of the late Advoyer, was by the same Method chosen Secret Counsellour. As by the Promotion of M. d'Erac, the Office of Treasurer was become vacant, the Choice for that Office fell upon M. de Warteville. A General Dyet of the Cantons being appointed to be opened To Morrow at Baden, this Canton has named two Deputies, who having Yesterday received their Instructions, set out To-Day for Baden.

Berlin, Nov. 15. N. S. On the 6th Instant the Lord Whitworth His Britannick Majesty's Ambassadour and Plenipotentiary, returned to this Court; and has since had Audience of the King of Prussia.

Paris, Nov. 22. The Prince of Rohan, who is appointed to deliver Mademoiselle de Montpensier to the Spaniards, and to receive the Infanta of Spain, designs to begin his Journey to the Frontiers of Spain a Fortnight hence: His Equipages will be very magnificent, and he takes with him 24 Gensdarmes, whom he has chosen out of that Guard, and who will attend him as his Gentlemen; as also 12 Pages, and above 30 Livery Servants. It is said 30000 Crowns were offered him by the Duke Regent towards the Expence of his Journey, but that he refused it; and that the King, to reward this Service, has granted him the Privilege of introducing the foreign Ambassadours to his Majesty's Audience; a Priviledge which the Princes of the House of Lorraine only have enjoyed hitherto. On the 19th Instant the Duke of Tallard (Son to the Marshal of that Name) arrived here from Rome; whence the Cardinal de Bissy is also expected within a few Days: It is said the Cardinal of Rohan will likewise come back very soon, and that the greatest Part of his Baggage is already upon the Road. The 19th Prince Dalhorucki,

Ambassadour Extraordinary from the Czar of Muscovy, had a private Audience of the King, when he delivered a Letter from the Czar his Master, to notify to his Majesty the Conclusion of the Peace with Sweden.
