

five at Bayone the 9th Instant, on his Way hither. Upon which the Preparations for their Catholick Majesties Journey to Bayone, with the Infanta Queen of France, are hastened; and for this Service his Majesty has bought the five magnificent Coaches which the late Duke of Ossuna had made in France, for a publick Entry on Occasion of the Peace of Utrecht. The Prince of Santo Buono, who lately arrived from Peru, where he was Vice-roy, came to Court on the 12th Instant, and the next Day in the Evening had a private Audience of the King, by whom he was very graciously received. The Court is gone into Mourning for the Death of the Great Dutchess of Tuscany, but will lay it aside at setting out on the Journey for Burgos.

*Berne, Nov. 19.* Letters from Zurich of the 15th Instant give an Account, that the Differences which had been subsisting some Time between the Canton of Glaris and their Subjects of the District of Werdenberg, not appearing likely to be accommodated peaceably by the Mediation of the Deputies of Zurich sent thither for that Purpose, the said Canton had caused 2000 Men to draw out and advance towards Werdenberg; on whose Approach to the Mountain called Schollberg, the Werdenbergers who had taken the Field likewise and seemed resolved to stand upon their Defence, retired for the most Part, with Precipitation into the neighbouring Country, and such as remained, being about a third Part of them, submitted entirely to their Masters, and carried their Arms into the Castle: That thereupon some of the chief Officers of Glaris having repaired to Werdenberg, sent out their Declaration immediately to those who had absented themselves, importing that unless they returned with all Diligence to their Houses, and made their Submission as the rest of them had done, they might expect to have Troops quartered upon them. These Threats had their Effect, the greatest Part of those who had retired having returned Home

and delivered up their Arms: Which done, the Troops of Glaris entred into the Country of Werdenberg, and soon after marched out again, without doing the least Injury or Damage, and are since gone Home. The Deputies of Zurich having been very instrumental in disposing by their Exhortations the Inhabitants of Werdenberg to make an absolute Submission; the Council of the Canton of Glaris deputed Sixteen of their Principal Members to thank those Mediators for the good Offices done by them in this Affair. This Canton of Berne having had Notice, that two Bales of Goods which came from about Lyons, were dispatched this Way for Germany from Geneva, and having passed as far as Moudon in the Pays de Vaud, were there stop't by Order of the Bailiff; the Council here took Cognizance of the Matter, and upon Debate resolved those Bales should forthwith be sent back to Geneva.

The Vicarages of Womersley, Askham, Bryan, Ledsham; the Curacies of Woolley in the Par. of Royston, Bolsterstone, Sand Hutton in the Par. of Thirsk, East Ardley, West Ardley alias Woodchurch and St. John in Beverley in the C. of York, and the Cur. of Woodborough in the C. of Nottingham, all in the D. of York; the Cur. of Llandgedwyn in the C. of Denbigh and D. of St. Asaph; the R. of Studland in the C. of Dorset and D. of Bristol; the V. of Ingcomb, Merston Magna, Pilton; the R. of Ilchester, the C. of St. James in Taunton Westhatch, Par. North Curry, and Glassenbury, all in the C. of Somerset and D. of Bath and Wells; the V. of Hanmer, C. Flint; the C. of Goosenargh Par. of Kirkham, C. Lancaster; the V. of Motram and Middlewich, and Cur. of Todmerden in the Par. of Rachedale in the C. and D. of Chester; the V. of Crosby Ravensworth, in the C. of Westmorland, and D. of Carlisle; the Cur. of Clea St. Margaret's, in the C. of Salop, and D. of Hereford; the V. of Abbots Langley, in the C. of Hertford; the Cur. of New Brentford, C. Middlesex, and the R. of Chipping Ongar, in the C. of Essex, all in the D. of London; the V. of Gosbertone, the Cur.
