Fiver at Bayone the 9th Inflant, on his land delivered up their Arms: Which done, the Troops of Glaris entred in to the Country of Werdenberg, and foon after murched out again, without doing the least Injury or Damage, and are tince gone Home. The Deputies of Zurich having been very inttrumental in disposing by their Exhorrations the Inhabitants of Werdenberg to make an absolute Submission; the Council of the Canton of Glaris defluted Sixteen of their Principal Members to thank those Mediators for the good Offices done by them in this Affair.
