Copenhagen, Dec. 6, N. S. On the 3d Instant M. Wiebe Secretary of State for the Domestick Affairs of Denmark, was nominated by the King to be Viceroy of Norway, and M. Rostgaard is made Secretary of State in his Room. M. Scheffelt Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, was at the same time declared Governour of the Province of Funen: And M. Bloom Councillour of State, succeeds him as Secretary: M. Mouch his Danish Majesty's Great Marshal, is made Governour of the Dutchy of Sleswick, and M. Holstein, who was Steward of the Household to the present Queen, is appointed Great Marshal in his Room. Baron Gerdsdorf, Marshal to the Prince Royal, is made Governour of Hulum.
