Madrid, November 24.

ON the 19th Instant the Count de las Torres caused a new Opera to be performed at his own Expence, for the Entertainment of the King and Queen, in the Amphitheatre at the Buen Retiro; which Opera is to be performed again on the Arrival of the Princess of Asturias, and afterwards will be brought upon the publick Stage here. The same Evening, before the Opera began, the Ladies of the Court kissed the Queen's Hand, that being the Saint's Day whose Name her Majesty bears; on which Occasion the Mourning for the late Dutchess of Tuscany was laid aside that Day. The Council of the Indies is directed to cause an Advice-Ship to be dispatched by the 20th of next Month from Cadiz for Vera Cruz; which Ship is to carry Notice that the Flota for New Spain will be dispatched early next Spring. It is advised from Cadiz, that several Bales of French Goods brought in thither by Dutch Ships had been publickly burnt, notwithstanding the Merchants to whom they were consigned, would have perswaded the Magistrates that they had been manufactured within the Dominions of the States General, but had counterfeit Seals or Marks affixed to them, as if they had been wrought in France. On the 21st the Duke of St. Simon arrived here; the next Day he had a private Audience of their Catholick Majesties; and Tomorrow he is to have his publick Audience. Their Catholick Majesties, with those of their Court whom they have nominated to attend them, designed to have gone to Burgos with the Infanta on her Way to France; but upon Advice that the Small-Pox is at this time very rife there, they now resolve to go to Lerma, a Place belonging to the Duke del Infantado, five Leagues short of Burgos; and the Day of their Departure is fixed to the 27th Instant.

Paris, Dec. 13. The Extract of the Advices relating to the Plague received by the Court from the Gevaudan, and communicated to the foreign Ministers, is as follows.

The Duke de Roquelaure writes the 24th of November, that he had Advice from M. la

Deveze of the 14th and 19th, that the Upper Gevaudan is in a good State of Health. He had caused a Tailour an Inhabitant of Mende who had escaped from thence to be shot dead. In Ville Rouffiet none had fallen ill within 40 Days past, nor at Chappinicz within 55. In St. Laryer de Peyre 145 Persons had died. Richiniac, Valendo, and Chaballier had not had any Inhabitants taken sick in several Days. Of the 120 Inhabitants of Chaballier, 24 were dead. At Mende two died on the 13th, one the 16th, four the 17th, and none from thence to the 19th. The five Villages or Hamlets in the Neighbourhood of Mende, which were infested, are well again. The Distemper has intirely ceased at Montrodât. Grises in the Neighbourhood of Marvejols is much in the same Condition it was; at Marvejols one died on the 13th, three on the 14th, none on the 15th, 16th and 17th. The Sickness has ceased in the three Hamlets of the Parish of Allier, as also in those within the Neighbourhood of la Canourgue; and of Cause towards Rouergue, one Village of six Houses excepted in the Parish of St. George where are some sick and the Place is well blocked up. At Nucjols a Man died three Weeks ago, and a Girl on the 16th of November. There are 172 Parishes of the Diocess of Mende, which have not been at all infested. La Canourgue will be disinfested the 20th. For eight Days past no Person has died or fallen ill at St. Paul la Coste. On the 17th eight Persons died at Alais in the Infirmary in the Suburbs: On the 18th a Man and a Child died there; on the 19th and 20th none died or fell sick either in the Town or in the Suburbs, or in the Houses of Quarantain.

Paris, Dec. 17. The Prince of Rohan set out Post the 12th Instant to overtake Mademoiselle de Montpensier, who was to arrive the 14th at Bourdeaux, where she will rest some Days. Mademoiselle de Vantadour has wrote a Letter to the King from Poictiers to acquaint his Majesty that the said Princess and all her Retinue were in perfect Health: The Infanta of Spain will arrive about the 9th of next Month

Month at Tru upon the Frontiers of France. The last Letters from Rome give an Account that the Cardinal of Rohan's Baggage set forward on the 22d past, and that his Eminency himself was to leave that City the 1st Instant to return hither. The Archbishoprick of Rheims is not yet disposed of; some are of Opinion that it will be given to the Abbot of Rohan, Cousin of the Cardinal of that Name, who accompanied the Cardinal to Rome. It is advised from Avignon, that the great Lazaretto of that Place had been set on Fire by Accident, and that above 400 Persons had perished in the Flames. The Distemper continues to rage there with very great Violence.
