Madrid, November 24. N the 19th Instant the Count de las Torres cauled a new Opera to be per-formed at his own Expence, for the Entertainment of the King and Queen, in the Amphitheatre at the Buen Retiro; which Opera is to be performed again on the Arrival of the Princels of Afturias, and afterwards will be brought upon the publick Stage here. The fame Evening, before the Opera began, the Ladies of the Court killed the Queen's Hand, that being the Saint's Day whofe Name her Majefty bears ; on which Occasion the Mourning for the late Dutchess of Tuf-cany was laid aside that Day. The Council of the Indies is directed to caule an Advice-Ship to be difpatched by the 20th of next Month from Cadiz for Vera Cruz; which Ship is to carry Notice that the Flota for New Spain will be dispatched early next Spring. It is advited from Cadiz, that feveral Bales of French Goods brought in thither by Datch Ships had been publickly burnt, notwithstand ing the Merchants to whom they were configned, would have perfwaded the Magistrates that they had been manufactured within the Dominions of the States General, but had counterfeit Seals or Marks affixed to them, as if they had been wrought in France. On the 21ft the Duke of St. Simon arrived here; the next Day he had a private Audience of their Catholick Majeffice; and To-Morrow he is to have his publick Audience. Their Catholick Majeffice, with those of their Court whom they have nominated to attend them, defigned to have gone to Burgos with the Infanta on her Way to France ; but upon Advice that the Small-Pox is at this time very tife there, they now refolve to go to Lerma, a Place belonging to the Duke del Infantado, five Leagues thort of Burgos; and the Day of

their Departure is fixed to the 27th Inftant. Paris, Dec. 13. The Extract of the Ad-vices relating to the Plague received by the Court from the Gevaudan, and communicated to the foreign Ministers, is as follows.

The Duke de Roquelaure writes the 24th of November, that he had Advice from M. la

Deveze of the 14th and 19th, that the Upper Gevaudan is in a good State of Health. He had cauled a Tarlour an lubabitant of Mende who had elcaped from thence to be fhot dead. In Ville Rouffet none had fallen ill within 40 Days paft, nor at Chapginicz within 55. In St. Latyer de Peyre 145 Persons had died. Richiniac, Valendo, and Chabalier had not bad any Inhabitants taken fick in feveral Days. Of the 120 Inhabitants of Chabalier, 25, were dead. At Mende two died on the 13th, one the 16th, four the 17th, and none from thence to the 19th. The five Villages or Hamlets in the Neighbourhood of Mende, which were infected, are well again. The Distemper has intirely cealed at Montrodat. Grites in the Neighbourhood of Marvejols is much in the fame Condition it was; at Mar-vejols one died on the 13th, three on the 14th, none on the 15th, 16th and 17th. The Sickness has ceased in the three Hamlets of the Parifh of Allier, as also in those within the Neighbourhood of Ia Canourgue; and of Cauffe towards Rouergue, one Village of fix Houles excepted in the Parish of St. George where are some fick and the Place is well blocked up. At Nucjols a Man died three Weeks sgo, and a Girl on the 16th of No-vember. There are 172 Parifhes of the Diocefs of Mende, which have not been at all infected. La Canourgue will be difinfec-ted the 20th. For eight Days past no Per-fon has died or fallen ill at St. Paul la Coste. On the 17th eight Perfons died at Alais in the Infirmary in the Suburbs: On the 18th a Man and a Child died there ; on the 19th and 20th none died or fell fick either in the Town or in the Suburbs, or in the Houses of Quarantain.

The Prince of Rohan fee Paris, Dec. 17. out Post the 12th Instant to overtake Mademoiselle de Montpensier, who was to arrive the t4th at Bourdeaux, where she will rest some Days. Mademoiscile de Vantadour has wrote a Letter to the King from Poictiers to acquaint his Majefty that the faid Princels and all her Retinue were in perfest Health : The Infanta of Spain will arrive about the 9th of next Meath

Month at Yill upon the Frontiers of France, The laftLetters fromRome give anAccount that the Cardinal of Rohan's Baggage fet forward on-the 22d paft, and that his Eminency him-felf was to leave that City the ift Instant to feturn hither. The Archbifhoprick of Rheims is not yet disposed of; some are of Opinion that it will be given to the Abbot of Rohan, Coulin of the Cardinal of that Name, who accompanied the Cardinal to Rome. It is adviled from Avignon, that the great Lazaretto of that Place had been fet on Fire by Accident, and that above 400 Persons had perished in the Flames. The Distemper continues to rage there with very great Violence.
