• 'Free' parking places in which vehicles may be parked free of charge between 8am and 6.30pm on Monday to Saturday for a maximum period of 30 minutes, with return to that parking place within a period of 1 hour prohibited, will be provided in all roads in the Schedule with the exception of Macarthur Close, Ismailia Road, Beauchamp Road, Wolseley Road, Elmhurst Road and Belton Road.

• Parking places which permit loading only between 8am and 11am Monday to Saturday. Between 11am and 6.30pm Monday to Saturday all other vehicles may then park free of charge for a maximum period of 30 minutes, with return to that parking place within a period of 1 hour prohibited, in Beauchamp Road, Cheshunt Road, Glenparke Road, Gower Road, St. John's Terrace, Skelton Road, Studley Road, Sylvan Road, Vale Road and Westbury Terrace.

• The relocation of a doctor parking place and a community disabled person's parking place in Upton Lane.

• Residents and businesses whose main address falls within the roads in the Schedule to this Notice will be eligible for permits.

The annual fee for a resident parking permit will be free for the first vehicle in a household,  $\pounds 50$  for the second vehicle and  $\pounds 100$  for a third vehicle or more. The fee for a business parking permit will be  $\pounds 100$  for 3 months,  $\pounds 200$  for 6 months and  $\pounds 300$  for an annual permit. Disabled resident parking permits will be issued free. Residents' visitor permits will be available. School visitor permits for use by visitors to schools and other educational institutions would be available to educational institutions.

6. If the provisions of any or all of the Orders continue in force for a

6. If the provisions of any or all of the Orders continue in force for a period of not lessthan six months, the Council will be considering in due course whether the provisions of any or all of the experimental Orders should be continued in force indefinitely by means of an Order or Orders under Sections 6 and/or 45 of the said Act of 1984.

7. Within a period of six months-

(a) beginning with the day on which the experimental Orders came into force (i.e. between 6 June 2012 and 6 December 2012; or

(b) if that Order is varied by another Order or modified pursuant to section 10(2)of the 1984 Act, beginning with the day on which the variation or modification or the latest variation or modification came into force

any person may object to the making of Orders for the purpose of such indefinite continuation.

8. Any such objection or other representation must be in writing. All objections must state the grounds on which they are made. ## THE NEWHAM (STRATFORD NORTH WEST) (WAITING AND LOADING RESTRICTION) (NO. 1) EXPERIMENTAL TRAFFIC ORDER 2012

1. NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the Council of the London Borough of Newham on 21 May 2012 made the above-mentioned Orders under section 9 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, as amended.

2. The general effect of the Orders will be to:

(a) Extend the existing Stratford North West Controlled Parking Zone (CPZ) restrictions into the streets and lengths of streets specified in Schedule 1 to this Notice. The restrictions will include:

• Parking places for permit holders only operating from 8am to 6.30pm on Monday to Friday.

• Waiting restrictions operating from 8am to 6.30pm on Monday to Friday or 'at any time'. (Note: for the Olympic Games from 27 July to 12 August and the Paralympic Games from 29 August to 9 September 2012 all waiting restrictions will operate at least between 8am and 9pm on Monday to Sunday).

• Disabled resident parking places, operating at any time, for use by disabled badge holders living in the CPZ who meet the current criteria for provision of disabled persons' parking places.

• 'Shared use' parking places in which vehicles without a permit may be left without charge, between 8am and 6.30pm on Monday to Friday for a maximum period of 30 minutes, with return to that parking place within a period of 1 hour prohibited, will be provided in Buckingham Road, Campbell Road E15, Gough Road, Heyworth Road and Idmiston Road. Vehicles displaying a permit may be left in these bays without time limit.

• Residents and businesses whose main address falls within the roads in the Schedule to this Notice will be eligible for permits.

(b) Reduce the operational hours of the Stratford North West CPZ from Monday to Sunday 8am to 6.30pm to Monday to Friday 8am to 6.30pm for the streets specified in Schedule 2 to this Notice.

(c) Reduce the operating hours of that part of the existing Stratford North West CPZ which borders roads in Waltham Forest, from Monday to Sunday 8am to 6.30pm to Monday to Saturday 8am to 6.30pm for the streets specified in Schedule 3 to this Notice.

(d) The operating hours of the existing short stay bays in the Stratford North West CPZ will be reduced from Monday to Sunday 6am to 10pm to Monday to Saturday 8am to 6.30pm.

3. The annual fee for a resident parking permit will be free for the first vehicle in a household, £50 for the second vehicle and £100 for a third vehicle or more. The fee for a business parking permit will be £100 for 3 months, £200 for 6 months and £300 for an annual permit. Disabled resident parking permits will be issued free. Residents' visitor permits will be available.
