A PROCLAMATION,

For Altering the Stamp for Hides and Skins to be Imported.

GEORGE R.

WHereas the Commissioners of the Custons in England, of Her late Majesty Queen Anne, did provide a Mark or Stamp for the marking or ftamping all the Hides or Skins, and Pieces of Hides and Skins, that fould be imported into England, and Skins, that fould be imported into England, the Dominion of Wales, and Town of Berwick on Tweed, during the continuance of Two feveral Arts of Parliament, the one made in the Ninth, and the other in the Tenth Year of Her faid late Majesty's Reign ; whereby feveral Duties were laid upon the faid Hides and Skins, and Pieces of Hides and Skins, fo to be imported during the continuance of those Arts ; which Mark or Stamp hath been found to be insufficient for flamping Hides and Skins imported in the Hair, in regard the same is taken off and Hair, in regard the fame is taken off and defaced by the dreffing thereof, to the great Hazard and Prejudice of the Dealers in Leat ther, who fe Goods remain liable to Seizure for want of the appearing of fuch Stamp ; for Pre-wention whereof for the future, we have thought fit. That the faid Mark or Stamp fhall, be alsered: We do therefore, by and with the Idd wire of our Privy-Council, by this our Royal Proclamation, in Execution of the Power vested in us by several AUS of Parliament, direct, pub-lish, and declares That from and after the Twenty fifth Day of December

next enfuing, the Mark or Stamp newly provided by our Command (the Impression subsreof is here made in the Margin) and no other, faall be made use of by the Offi-cers of our Customs for the mark-

pole from and after the faid Twenty fifth Day of December : And hereof the Commiffioners, and other the Officers of our Customs, and all others, whom it may concern, are hereby required to take Notice.

Madrid, Dec. 1. On the 25th patt at Noon, the Duke of St. Simon Ambassadour from the most Christian King had publick Audience of his Catholick Majesty : Don Gaspar Giron, Majordomo for the Week, in one of the King's Coaches, fetched him from his Houle, together with the Marquess de Maulevrier (who that Day took upon him the Character of Ambaffadour, only for affifting the next Day at the figaing of the matrimonial Con-ventions, and has fince laid it down.) They paffed to the Court, preceded by 12 Pages, and 17 Footmen, in rich Liveries, and followed by fix of the Ambaffadour's Constea Their Freedlencies had Audience bf Coaches. Their Excellencies had Audience of the King, the Queen, the Infanta, and the Princes. At Night a Firework was let off in the lefter Court of the Palace. On the 26th

paft in the Evening their Majefties went pub-lickly to the Chapel of our Lady of Atocha; and in their Return paffed through the Plaza Major, where by Order of the Corregidor all the Windows were illuminated with Wax-Tapers. On the 27th in the Forenoon, the Infanta, the Prince of Afturias, and the Infante Don Ferdinand, fet out from hence, and at Four in the Afternoon were followed by the King and Queen, to lie at Alcala; from whence they will proceed by easy Days Journies to Lerma.
