Whitehall, Dec. 23. An humble Address to His Majesty from the Governour, Council and Assembly of the Bermuda or Sommer Islands in America, having been transmitted from thence and delivered by Sir John Bennet, the said Governour's Brother, to the Right Honourable the Lord Carteret one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, has been presented by his Lordship to His Majesty, who was pleased to receive it very graciously.

Paris, Dec. 27. M. du Bois Brother to the Cardinal of that Name, is gone Post from hence to St. Jean de Luz, where he is to sign jointly with M. de la Roche Secretary of the King of Spain's Cabinet, the Act of Exchange of the two Princesses. Madame de Vantadour has written a Letter to the King, to acquaint his Majesty with Mademoiselle de Montpensier's Arrival at Bourdeaux, and that she hoped that Princess would be able to reach the Frontiers by the 7th of next Month. On the 24th Instant M. de Coulanges Comptroller of the King's Household, set out from hence to attend the Infanta at Bayonne. The King has made a Promotion of about 150 Knights of the Order of St. Louis, in favour of the Officers of the Marine, the Gallies, and the Colonies. Several Merchants of this City and of that of Rouen have formed a Company for Re establishing the Commerce of the Town of Marfeilles

to the Levant, and 'tis said they have already remitted considerable Sums to that Place for that purpose.
