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Paris, January 10.

THE Exchange of the two Princeffee upon the Frontiers of Spain, which was fixed up the Sch or 9th Instant, is put off for found Days longer, Advices being arrived at Gourt that the River Adour had fo much overflowed, that Mademoifelle de Montpenfier had been obliged to ftop ; and that the like overflowing of Rivers had happened in Bilcay where the Infants of Spain was to pais. M. Lawlels, who fince the Duke d'Offuna's Arrival here had taken upon him the Chara-er of Ambaffadour Extraordinary from the Catholick King, is recalled, and will fer outfhorthy for Ma forca, of which Island the King of Spain has made him Governour. The Duke of Bournonville, formerly Baron de Caprés, is named by the Court of Madrid to refide here in Quality of Ambaffadour Extraordinary. The Marquele de Villequier, Son to the Duke d'Aumont, is made a Duke and Peer, upon the voluntary Refignation of his Father, who has referved to himfelf only the Title of Duke, with the ordinary Prerogatives at Court. It is faid the Duke de Lauzun is going to pais the Remaindet of his Life in Retirement. The following Extract of the Advices relating to the Plague received by the Court to the 7th of January, has been communicated to the foreign Ministers.

M. de Rambion Brigadier in the Vivaretz, in his Letter of the 24th of December, continues to affure us that the Vivaretz is in a good State of Health. Tabias has not the Differmper, a Woman and a Child who had the Small Pox there are recovered. Ar Laurat the Sicknels continues offly in that Houle which was fingly infected. At St. Genaix feveral Perfons who were fick recover daily, and fione has died there fick tecover daily, and fore has died there fick the 15th. In general the Mortality has very much decreated every where. M. de Rothe Lieutenant General in his of the 22d, 24th and 26th of December, writes, that two had died at Concoules the 21ft and 22d. At Genouillag one was dead of old Ago, and three had been newly taken ill. From the 19th to the 24th, 20 were dead and two newly fallen fick at Alais. M. the Cauffade Bright in his of the 22d of December confirms the good State of Health of the Lower Auvergne, and the Decreale of the Plague in the Genaudan. M. de la Deveze writes the 16th of December, that it was hoped the Diftemper would 'loog ceale at

Mende's in the mean time three or four Per fons died and fix or feven felt ill there daily f in the liferimaries there were 132 recovering. At Marvejoledied one or two a Day ; good Order was te eftablished there, and they wan-ted Ingredients for Perfumes. No new Plater was infected. At Fontanez only one Ferlon was fick, and of an ordinary Diftemper. The Sicknels at Ras was ftopt by the flutting up of one Houle which war infected. He had cauled fix Buriers of the Dead of Mende, to take away & fick Perlon from an Houle af Nuejole, and carry him to Mende. The Will count de Beaufie Lieurenant General in his of the 21ft of December confirms the Decrease of the Diftemper in the Gevaudan, and fays the the Diffemper in the Gevaudan, and lays the whole Number of the dead there to that time was reckolled to be 4796. Two Perlons had died at 14. Cheourgue pretty fuddeoly, ant a Woman was fallen fick ; but ic was judged to be of ordinary Diftempers. Ras; Fontanez, and Nuejols, which had been fal, pretted, are in perfect Health. For 40 Days ipaft no new Place had been infected in the Gevandad. Langogne which had been put under Quarantaih on Account of a Burier of the dead, who fled thither from Mende, had not in 38 Diyr had any fick or dead. 'The Abbey of Chambon and the Farms belonging to it, are abfolutely free from the Plague.
