Paris, January 21.

Courier arrived here some Days ago from the Prince of Rohan, with Advice that the Exchange of the two Princesses was made the 9th Instant upon the Frontiers of Spain, and that they were both in perfect Health. The Infanta will arrive at Pariethe 2d or 3d of March; the Number of the Workmen who are employed at the Oid Louvre in fitting up the Apartments for that Princels and her Retinue, is increased. Mademoiselle de Montpensier passed through Bayonne, she was received there with great Magnificence by the Queen Downger of Spain; and 'tis said that the Presents that Princess made to Mademoiselle and to the Ladies that accompanied her, amount to the Value of 6 or 700000 Livres. The Abbot Tanfin has fent by an Express the Pope's Dispensation for the Conclusion of Mademoiselle de Montpenfier's Marriage with the Prince of Afturias. M. de Penterrider the Emperour's Minister here having received Orders from his Court to repair to Cambray, had on the 16th Instant a private Audience of the King, to take his Leave of his Majesty, and will set out the beginning of next Month. Don Louis d'Acun-ha the King of Portugal's Ambassadour here, will follow him shortly to the Congress. The Duke d'Ossuna's Departuse for Spain is fixed to the 24th or 25th Instant. The Count de Tavannes is named by the King Commander of Burgundy, and he will set out next Week for Dijon, in order to accommodate a Dispute which has lately arisen between the Parliament and the Bishop of Langres. The Duke of Chartres is out of Danger, his Fever having ceased since the 16th Instant. He has bow-ever a very violent Cold upon him, which obliges him to keep his Apartment. M. Dupont the commanding Officer at Toulon, writes the 27th of December, that that Town continues in good Health, without any Relapse: But it is not quite so well with the Neighbourhood, where some Sparks of the Diftemper have broke out. M. d'Orsay writes the 1st of January, some Distemper makes no great Progress at Orange; no more than 124 Persons have died there; the Distemper which had got into some Farms had intirely ceased. Vizan, a Place in the Comtat on this Side of the Line, within a League of Tullette, is blocked up by Order of M. de Belrieu; some Inhabitante there had died of the Pleurify, but it was judged there was nothing more to be feared. non still lofes many of its People, the Distemper having raged afresh there since the 15th of December. Sarrians has fost 30 Persons since it was infected. Mazan is suspected, because a Man lately died there suddenly either of a Tumour or a Sore. M. de Vedrille in bis of the 27th and 31ft of December, fends two Letters from Orange and Avignon of the 24th and 27th: In fix Days only one Child of five or fix Years old had died at Orange, and that without any outward Marks of Contagion.
