## Paris, January 31.

HE Cardinal de Rohan arrived here on the 28th Inftant from Rome, and has fince kept his Chamber, being indifpoled of the Gout. It is faid the Court is very well fatisfied with the Services he has done in Iraly, and that he will have a great Share in the Difpolition of the vacant Benefices. Madame de Chiverny, who conducted Mademoilelle de Montpenfier to the Frontiers of Spain, is allo come back hither, and has brought with her the Prince of Afturias's Picture fet with Diamonds, which that Prince had fent her for a Prefent. The King made fome Days ago a Promotion among the Officers of the Marine. It is faid his Majefty will make fhortly a Promotion of feveral Marefchals of France, and they talk among others of the Duke of Noailles, the Marquefs d'Allegre, the Count de Medavi, and the Prince of Tingry. The Duke of Chartres being recovered of his Fever, is now in a Condition to walk about, and his Highnefs receives the Compliments upon his Recovery from all Perfons of Diffinction. The following Extract of the Advices relating to the Plague received by the Court to the \* a8th of January, has been communicated to the foreign Minifters.

M. de Rambion Brigadier in the Vivaretz, in his Letters of the 12th and 13th of January writes, that it had been proved a Man who died fuddenly near St. Marcel d'Ardeche, was taken off by an Epileptick Fit: The Brigadier was expecting Orders from M. de Rothe to raife the Blockade of four Houfes where that Man had been. 14 Houfes without Aubenas which had been put under Quarantain, were in good Health. Laurac in the Country with which Communication is prohibited has had three Houfes infected ; that Place is blocked up. The reft of the Vivaretz is in good Health. M. d'Iverny Brigadier employed in the Sevennes, in his of the 13th of January confirms in general the Decreafe of the Diftemper. M. de Rothe Lieutenant-General in his of the 14th and 16th of January advifes, that the Sicknefs feemed to be ceasing every where. M. de Fleyres who commands at Marvejols, in his of the 36th of December writes, that the Town was then in the 13th Day of its Quarantain, without the leaft Inconvenience; the Violence of the Diftemper was abated. He had cauled the dead to be buried deep in the ground, and the Streets to be cleaned; good Order was kept in all other refpects by the Care and Vigilance of the Phylicians. The Bifhop of Alais in his of the 9th and 12th of January writes, that the Diftemper feemed to be on the Decline; that in all Events the Town was fupplied with Provisions for three Months, and Infirmaries in readinefs to receive above 300 fick ; the Number of which was then but 23 or 23.

M. de Launay the commanding Officer in the County of Sault, in his of the 8th and 16th of January, advises that Dau-hing continuer in good Health and that the Linge phiné continues in good Health, and that the Lines are well kept. Avignon ftill lofes 25 or 30 Per-fons a Day. The Advices from Orange tell us, that none were fick there, and that the infected Places of the Comtat were growing better and better; but the Advices from those Parts are fub-ject to Variation. M. de Vedrille in his of the 13th of January writes, that the Contagion which was thought to be extinct at Orange, had broke out again, two having fallen fick on the 9th. The Marquels de Brancas writes the 9th of January, that there were 12 fick still in the Infirmaries of Alauch, moit of them out of Danger. The general Difinfection ended the 8th, and ic was hoped no new Accident would happen. Had it not been for the Relapfe at Alauch, the Prohibition of Communication with Marfeilles would have been taken off. The Marquels had been informed by M. du Pont, that the Sicknels in the two Bastides of Ollioules had gone off without any ill Confe-quences. Nothing is faid in thefe Letters of Beffe and Roquebruffanne, which is a Sign of their being perfectly well.
