Paris, February 7.

THE Chevalier de Reziers, Captain of the Duke of St. Simon's Regiment of Horse, arrived here the 30th of last Month from Lerma, with Advice that Mademoiselle de Montpensier arrived there the 20th, that the Ceremonies of the Marriage between that Princess and the Prince of Asturias were performed that Evening, and that the whole Court was to set out the 23d to return to Madrid. On the 1st Instant his Majesty being at Mals had a slight Indisposition, but being returned to his Apartment, found himself very well again, and is now in perfect Health. He is to receive the Communion for the first time at Easter, and the Ceremony of his Inauguration will be performed the 25th of May at Rheims, which Journey will last about a Fortnight, and 'tis said the Duke and Dutches of Lorraine will be there incognito. The Prince of Rohan is arrived here, having left the Infanta of Spain at Bourdeaux, where she was to remain some Days, because the Waters being out had rendered the Roads about that Place almost impracticable. If the Apartments which are fitting up here for that Princess at the Old Louvre, cannot be got ready against the Time of her Arrival, 'tis said she will stay some Days at Vincennes, whither Furniture has been sent for that Purpose. We have an Account that the King of Spain has granted to the Duke of St. Simon the Dignity of Grandee of Spain, with Liberty to dispose of it in Favour of any of his Descendants; that his Catholick Majesty has given the Order of the Golden Fleece to that Duke's Eldest Son; and that he has made the Marquess de la Farre Knight of the same Order. It is believed that since his Catholick Majesty has resolved to continue the Duke d'Osuna here some time longer in Quality of Ambassadour Extraordinary, the Duke of St. Simon will also remain at Madrid in the same Quality.

His Majesty has been pleased to appoint the Right Honourable the Lord Hinchinbrook, to be Lieutenant and Custos Rotulorum of the County of Huntingdon.

His Majesty has been pleased to appoint the Reverend Dr. Trimmell to be Dean of Winchester, in the Room of Dr. Wickart deceased.

Navy-Office, Jan. 31, 1721-22.

The Right Honourable the Lords of the Treasury, having appointed Money for paying of Half-Pay to Sea-Officers from the 31st of December 1720 to the 30th of June 1721, according to His Majesty's Establishment on that behalf; These are to give Notice, that the said Payments will begin to be made at the Treasurer of the Navy's-Office in Broadstreet, on Monday the 12th of February next for the Captains, Tuesday the 13th for the Lieutenants, and on Wednesday the 14th for the Masters, that all Persons concerned may then and there attend to receive what may become payable to them, and not only bring with them the Affidavits required, touching their not having enjoyed the Benefit of any Publick Employment whatsoever, either at Sea or on Shore, during the time they are to be paid the said Half-Pay, but also produce Certificates (if they have not already done it) that they have subscribed the Test and taken the Oaths required by the late Act of Parliament; and in case any of the said Officers shall not be able to attend themselves to receive their Money, but employ Assornies for that purpose, that the said Assornies may produce the like Certificates and Affidavits from the Persons they are employed by.

Navy-Office, Feb. 2, 1721-22:

This is to give Notice, that the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury have been pleased to appoint Money to pay all the Arrears due to the Pensioners belonging to the Chest at Chatham to Lady-Day last; and that the said Pay will begin on Tuesday the 6th of March next, at the Hill-House in Chatham.

On Monday the 19th of this Instant February will begin a Payment of One Year's Pension-Money due to all such Invalid Out-Pensioners as are upon the Establishment of His Majesty's Royal Hospital near Chelsea, commencing the 24th of June 1720, and ending the 24th of June 1722 inclusive.
