Yesterday in the Afternoon the King, Queen, and Prince of Asturias went incognito three Leagues from hence to visit Made-moiselle de Montpensier, and returned the same Night without the Princess, who arrived here this Day at Two in the Afternoon, and was married to the Prince an Hour afterwards in publick by the Cardinal de Borja, in the Presence of the King, who immediately after the Ceremony offered the Dignity of a Grandee of Spain to the Duke of St. Simon or for either of his Sons, who chose it for the Youngest, upon which the King gave the Order of the Golden Fleece to the Eldest, as also to the Marquess de la Farre.

Madrid, Jan. 26, N. S. Their Catholick Majesties with the Prince and Princess of Asturias arrived here this Evening; the Princess having for these two Days been indisposed with the Tooth-ach, it occasioned the putting off the Ball at Court, which otherwise was intended for this Night. The Duke de Bournonville set out last Week on his Embassy for Paris, but was overtaken three Leagues from hence with an Order from his Catholick Majesty to return to Madrid; and last Night the Duke d'Osuna was declared Ambassadour to reside at Paris. Mr. Stratford, Agent of the British South-Sea Company, arrived here three Days ago.

Paris, Feb. 14. An Assembly of the Council of the Regency is to be held To-morrow, at which the Duke of Chartres, who is very well recovered from his late Indisposition, will assist. The Prince of Conti is likewise abroad again, and was two Days ago to see the King and the Duke Regent. Preparations are making for the Entry of the Infanta of Spain: The Magistrates of this City have given Orders to their Architect to prepare five Triumphal Arches, under which that Princess is to pass the Day of her Entry; and there will be Illuminations and Fireworks for three Nights successively. The Day after her Arrival here a Te Deum will be sung at Nôtre Dame, where the Cardinal de Noailles will officiate, at which the King, the Duke Regent, and all the Princes of the Blood are to assist. That Princess will stop some Days at Orleans, and not at Vincennes, as was given out, till her Apartments in the Old Louvre are in a Readiness. It is said four new Regiments of Dragoons are to be raised, and to have the Names of Chartres, Bourbon, Charolois, and Conti. It is also said that the King will shortly hold a *Lit de Justice*, wherein the Duke du Maine will be re-established in his Honours and Prerogatives of legitimated Prince of the Blood. M. le Pelletier de Souffi one of the Councillours of the Council of Regency, has retired to the Abbey of St. Victor, to pass there the remainder of his Life.
