the Marquels de la Farre.

Madrid, Jan. 26, N. S. Their Catholick Majeflies with the Prince and Princess of Asturias arrived here this Evening; the Princess having for these two Days been indisposed with the Toothsch, it occssioned the putting off the Ball at Court, which otherwise was intended for this Night. The Duke de Bournonville set out last Week on his Embassy for Paris, but was over-taken three Leagues from hence with an Order from his Catholick Majesty to return to Madrid; and last Night the Duke d'Ossuna was declared Ambassadur to reside at Paris. That Princes will stop some Days at Orleans, and not at Vincennes, as was given out, till her Apartments in the Old Louvre are in a Readiness.
