Things, by way of Lottery, or by Lots, Tickets, Numbers, or Figures & or shall make, print, advertise, or publish, or caulo to be made, printed, adver-tifed, or published, Proposals or Schemes for advancing imail Sums of Money by leveral Persons, amounting in the whole to large Sums, to bet divided among them, by the Chances of the Prizes in Some Publick Lottery or Lotteries, eftsbliftet of allowed by Act of Parliament ; or mall deliver out, or caule of procure to be delivered out, Tickets to the Perfons advancing fuch Sums, to entitle them to a Share of the Money fo advanced, according to fuch Propofals or Schemes; or fhall make, print, or publiffs or caufe to be made, printed, or published, any Proposal or Scheme of the Like Kind or Nature, under any Denomination, Name, or Title whatfoever, and shall be thereof convicted upon the Oath or Oaths of one or more credible Witnefeor Witneffer, by two or mare Juffices of the Peace of the Counsy, Divisions or Liberry, where such Offence shall be committed, or the Offender shall be found (which Oath fuch Juffices of the Peace are hereby impowered and requited to adminifter) the Person so convicted shall for every fuch Offence, over and above any former Pe-nalties inflicted by any former Act or Acts of Parliament made against any private or unlawful Lotteries, forfeit the Sum of Five hundred Pounds, one third part thereof to His Majefty, His Heirs and Succeffors, one other third part thereof to the Informer, and the remaining third part thereof to the Poor of the Parish where such Offence shall be committed ; the fame to be levied by Diffresa and Sale of the Offenders Goods, by Warrant under the Hands and Seals of fuch Juffices before whom fuch Offender Shall be convicted, as afore faid ; and fhall alfo, for every fuch Offence, by fuch Ju-flices be committed to the County Goal; there to remain without Bail or Mainprize for the Space of one whole Year, and from thence till the faid Sum of Five hundred Pounds fo forfeited, as aforefaid, shall be fully paid and sa-tisfied: Provided nevertheles, That any Per-son who shall think himself or herself aggrieved by the Judgment or Determination of two or more fuch Justices in any the Cafes aforefaid, shall have Liberty to appeal to the next Quarter Sessions to be held for the County, City, or Place where such Judgment or Determination shall be made or given ; and that the Judgment to be given by the Justices at the faid next Quarter Sessions, shall be final.

fuch Sales, Lotterice, Propofale, or Schemes, aforefaid, shall forfeit, for every such Offence, double the Sum paid or contributed, to be recovered with Colts of Suit, by Action of Debt, Bill, Plaint or Information, in any of His Ma-jesty's Courts of Record at Westminster wherein no Elloign, Protection, Wager of Law, nor any more than one Imparlance shall be allowed; one Moiety thereof to His Majefty, His Heirs and Succeffors, the other Moiety thereof to the Person or Persons who shall inform or fue for the fame.
