THE BEXLEY (PRESCRIBED ROUTES) (ERITH) TRAFFIC ORDER 20XX

- 1. NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the Council of the London Borough of Bexley propose to make the above-mentioned Order under section 6 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 as amended by Section 8 of and Part 1 of Schedule 5 to the Local Government Act 1985 and all other enabling powers.

THE BEXLEY (WAITING AND LOADING RESTRICTION) (AMENDMENT NO. 4) TRAFFIC ORDER 2013

THE BEXLEY (SIDCUP STATION AREA) (PARKING PLACES) (AMENDMENT NO. 1) TRAFFIC ORDER 2013.

- 1. NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the Council of the London Borough of Bexley on 18th February 2013, made the above mentioned Traffic Orders under sections 6 and 124 of and Part IV of schedule 9 to the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, as amended by Section 8 of and Part 1 of Schedule 5 to the Local Government Act 1985.
- 2. The general effect of the Bexley (Waiting and Loading Restriction) (Amendment No. 4) Traffic Order 2013; which comes into force on 21st February 2013, would be to further amend the Bexley (Waiting and Loading Restriction) (No. 1) Traffic Order 2012 to:—
- (i) change existing no waiting 8~am to 6.30~pm Monday to Saturday waiting restrictions at the western end of Jubilee Way , Sidcup, to no waiting at any time.
- 3. The general effect of the Bexley (Sidcup Station Area) (Parking Places) (Amendment No.1) Traffic Order 2013, which comes into force on 21st February 2013, would be to amend the Bexley (Sidcup Station Area) (Parking Places) Traffic Order 2012 to :—
- (i) revise the extents of, and introduce new parking places at the western end of Jubilee Way, Sidcup, to operate Monday to Saturday, 8 am to 6.30 pm, 1 hour maximum stay, no return within 1 hour.
- NOTE. A bus stop clearway is also relocated as part of the scheme but this does not require a Traffic Management Order (TMO).

- 5. Copies of the Orders, the Bexley (Waiting and Loading Restriction) (No. 1) Traffic Order 2012, the Bexley (Sidcup Station Area) (Parking Places) Traffic Order 2012 (and the Orders that have amended those Orders where applicable), the Council's statement of reasons for making the Orders, and a plan which indicates the length of roads to which the Orders relate can be inspected during normal office hours on

Persons desiring to question the validity of the Orders or any provision contained therein on the grounds that it is not made within the relevant powers of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 or that any of the relevant requirements thereof or of any relevant regulation made under has not been complied with in relation to the Order, may make application for the purpose to the High Court before the expiration of 6 weeks from the date on which the Orders were made.

PROPOSED ADDITIONAL 'RESIDENTS ONLY' PARKING BAY IN WOODPLACE LANE, COULSDON

PROPOSED ADDITIONAL SHARED USE PAY AND DISPLAY/PERMIT BAY IN JUNCTION ROAD, SOUTH CROYDON

PROPOSED ADDITIONAL LIMITED TIME FREE PARKING BAY IN COULSDON ROAD, OLD COULSDON

PROPOSED LOADING BAY IN MITCHAM ROAD, CROYDON PROPOSED REDUCTION IN LENGTH OF FREE PARKING BAYS IN LINTON GLADE, SELSDON AND RUSSELL HILL, PURLEY.

- 1. NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that Croydon Council, proposes to make Traffic Orders under the relevant sections of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 and all other enabling powers.
- 2. The general effect of the Orders would be to:
- (a) introduce 1 additional 'resident only' parking bay outside Nos. 5 and 7 Woodplace Lane. Vehicles parking in the bays between the hours 11am to 12 Noon on Mondays to Fridays inclusive would need to display a valid residents' parking permit. The cost of a resident parking permit is £76 for the first permit, £126 for a second permit and £305 for the third and final permit;
- (b) introduce 1 additional 8 hour 'pay and display'/permit parking bay in Junction Road, South Croydon, adjacent to No. 63 Brighton Road 2 existing bays will be reconfigured to provide the new bay which operates between 9am to 5pm, Monday to Saturday; maximum charge £5 for 8 hours, resident permit charges as above;
- (c) introduce I additional limited time free parking bay outside No. 231A Coulsdon Road and partially across frontage of No. 233 (2 wheels up), the maximum stay would be 30 minutes, no return in I hour;
