Turin, March 21, N. S. N the 18th Inftant in the Evening, the King and Queen, the Prince and Princels, with the Court, made their Entry into this City in a very fplendid Manner : They ftopt till Night at la Gioia a little Caftle about a Mile from hence : As foon as it was dark they proceeded hither, and on a Signal given the Illuminations were on a fudden lighted; and 180 Pieces of Cannon from the Citadel and the Ramparts were thrice discharged, while the Coach of State with the King, Queen, Prince and Princels, preceeded by 24 Coaches with Six Horles and the King's Livery-Servants, and followed by a Squadron of the Horle-Guards, came through the Street of Po to Madame Royale's Apartments; where the Princels paid her Respects to her, and af-terwards appeared at the Queen's Circle. The Coaches of the Princeffes de Carignan, of the Princels Loubila, and feveral of the Nobility, made a long Train, and the March was closed by the Regiment of Royal Dragoons. The next Evening the Princess attended by most of the Nobility passed through the Principal Streets, as well to thew herfelf to the People, as to vifit the Churches, and fee the Illuminations, which were very magnificent and beautiful, and were continued the third Night,
