Highways Agency ROAD TRAFFIC REGULATION ACT 1984

THE A2 TRUNK ROAD (DOVER ROAD) (LAY-BY CLOSURES) (EXPERIMENTAL) ORDER 2013

The Secretary of State for Transport hereby gives notice that he made this Order under sections 9(1)(a) and 3, (10)(1) and (2) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 on the 7th May 2013, coming into force on the 21st May 2013, on the A2 Trunk Road (Dover Road) northwest of Dover in the County of Kent.

The effect of the Order is to close the lay-bys in

(a) the coastbound carriageway of the A2 (Dover Road) between points 860 metres and 1020 metres east of its junction with Lydden Hill, 905 metres and 1065 metres north of Temple Farm underbridge and 300 metres and 470 metres south of Temple Farm underbridge; and

(b) the Londonbound carriageway of the A2 (Dover Road) between points 830 metres and 990 metres east of its junction with Lydden Hill, 935 metres and 1095 metres north of Temple Farm underbridge and 290 metres and 460 metres south of Temple Farm underbridge;

for an experimental period of up to eighteen months from the date the Order comes into force. The Order contains a provision under section 10(2) of the Act allowing a specified officer to modify or suspend the operation of the Order or any provision of it if it appears to him essential in the interests of the expeditious, convenient and safe movement of traffic.

The Secretary of State will be considering in due course whether the provisions of this Order should be made permanent. Any person desiring to object to the making of a permanent Order should send, not later than 20th November 2013, a written statement of his or her objection and of the grounds thereof to the Highways Agency at the address shown above, quoting the reference HA/SE/2013/A2/PERM2. Information provided in response to this consultation, including personal information, may be subject to publication or disclosure in accordance with the access to information regimes (these are primarily the Freedom of Information Act 2000 (FOIA), the Data Protection Act 1998 (DPA) and the Environmental Information Regulations

THE A5 TRUNK ROAD (WATLING STREET, TOWCESTER, NORTHAMPTONSHIRE) (PROHIBITION AND RESTRICTION OF WAITING, PROHIBITION OF ENTRY AND ONE WAY) ORDER 20XX

THE SECRETARY OF STATE FOR TRANSPORT hereby gives notice that he intends to make an Order under sections 1(1), 2(1) and (2) and 4(1) and (2) of, and paragraph 27(1) of Schedule 9 to, the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 on the A5 Trunk Road at Towcester in the County of Northamptonshire.

The effect of the Order would be to

- 1. Prohibit, with exemptions, any vehicle from waiting at any time on (a) the east side of the A5
- (i) between points 42 metres northwest and 62 metres southeast of the centreline of its junction with Northampton Road;

- (ii) from a point 99 metres southeast of the centreline of its junction with Northampton Road to a point 86 metres northwest of the centreline of its junction with that part of the A5 that leads to Chantry Lane;
- (iii) from a point 62 metres northwest of the centreline of its junction with that part of the A5 that leads to Chantry Lane to a point 61 metres southeast of the centreline of its junction with Church Lane; (iv) on the post idea of the Market Scarper and the property of the Market Scarper

(iv) on the east side of the Market Square car park area between points 62 metres and 25 metres northwest of the centreline of its junction with that part of the A5 that leads to Chantry Lane;

- (v) on the east side of the Market Square car park area from a point 5 metres northwest of the centreline of its junction with that part of the A5 that leads to Chantry Lane to that junction;
- (b) the west side of the A5
- (i) from a point 28 metres northwest of the centreline of its junction with Brackley Road to a point 14 metres southeast of the centreline of its junction with Park Street;
- (ii) from a point 50 metres southeast of the centreline of its junction with Park Street to a point 14 metres southeast of the centreline of its junction with Richmond Road:
- (c) the north side of that part of the A5 that leads from its junction with the southbound carriageway of the A5 to its junction with Chantry Lane: or
- (d) the south side of that part of the A5 that leads from its junction with the southbound carriageway of the A5 to its junction with Chantry Lane
- 2. Prohibit any vehicle from waiting for a period of more than two hours with no return within one hour on any day except Sunday on the east side of the A5
- (i) between points 62 metres and 99 metres southeast of the centreline of its junction with Northampton Road; and
- (ii) on the west side of the Market Square car park area in the parking bays between points 50 metres and 5 metres northwest of the centreline of that part of the A5 that leads to Chantry Lane.
- 3. Prohibit any disabled person's vehicle from waiting for a period of more than two hours with no return within one hour on any day except Sunday on the east side of the Market Square car park area in the disabled person's parking bays between points 25 metres and 5 metres northwest of the centreline of that part of the A5 that leads to Chantry Lane.
- 4. Prohibit any vehicle, other than goods vehicles (for the purposes of loading or unloading) from waiting at any time on the west side of the A5 between points 34 metres and 50 metres southeast of the centreline of its junction with Park Street.
- 5. Prohibit any vehicle from entering
- (i) the Market Square car park area at its junction with that part of the A5 that leads to Chantry Lane, or
- (ii) the southbound carriageway of the A5 from the Market Square car park.
- 6. Prohibit any vehicle from proceeding in the Market Square car park area in any direction other than southeastwards.
