Turin, April 22, N. S.

ON the 16th Instant the Princess of Piedmont went with twelve Ladies, to pass the Evening at the Queen's Vineyard upon the Hill of the Capuchins, within two Miles of this Town; where they were entertained by her Majesty's Order with a fine Collation and Musick. On the 18th there was a second publick Ball at Court, at which his Sardinian Majesty did not appear, having had a Fit of the Gout for some Days past; he is now somewhat better, but still keeps in his private Apartment. The Marquess de Lussay, a Gentleman formerly much employed and trusted by his Sardinian Majesty, died on the 18th, of the Gout in his Stomach.

Paris, April 29. The King's Coronation at Rheims, which was declared to be fixed to the Beginning of September next, is now said to be put off till the Vintage is over: This Delay will afford Time for settling the necessary Preparations and the Order to be observed at that Ceremony: The French and Swiss Guards will be ordered thither before, and are to incamp in the Neighbourhood of Rheims. Yesterday in the Afternoon, the King accompanied by the Count de Clermont went into the Park of Vincennes to take the Diversion of Hawking. The Marhal de Villeroy being ill of the Gout could not attend his Majesty as usual. On the 26th, the Dutchess Dowager of Orleans and the Duke of Chartres came to the Church of the Priory of St. Martin, to be present at the Consecration of the Bishop of Laon. The same Day the Deputies of Artois were introduced to his Majesty, the Regent being present, by the Duke d'Elbœuf Governour of that Province. On the 27th the Regiment of Swiss Guards passed in Review, in the Plain des Sablons, before the Duke du Maine, who was accompanied by his Sons the Prince of Dombes and the Count d'Eu: And Yesterday the Regiment of French Guards was reviewed by the Duke de Gramont their Colonel. Both those Regiments are to pass in Review before his Majesty the Beginning of next Month.
