### From Eucldap May 1. to Saturdap May 5. 1722.

St. James's, the 5th Day of May, 1722. IS Majefty in Council was this Day pleafed to order the Right Honourable the Lord High Chancellour to isfue Writs for Proroguing the Parliament which was appointed to meet on the roth of this Inftant, to Tuefday the sth of June next; and allo for Prorogu-ing the Gonvocations of Canterbury and York which were appointed to meet on the 18th of this Inflant, to Friday the 29th of the faid Month of June

Madrid, April 28. By an Express from Cadiz we have the News of the Arrival there of an Advice-Boat which came from Vera Cruz the 6th of January last. We have an Account by this Veffel, that the Spanish Galleon and the British South-Sea: Company's Ship arrived in December laft at Cartagena, where European Goods then bore a very high Price.

Berne, April 22, NS. Advices from Coire of the 7th Inftant, tell us they had an Account there from Vienna and Milan, that his Imperial Ma-jefty had approved and ratified the Treaty called the Capitulat, which the Baron de Greuth the Imperial Envoy with the Grifons negociated and adjusted some time ago with that State, but

which had not been ratified till now. Turin, April 29, N.S. On the 26th Inflant Count Belgioiofo had a private Audience of his Sardining Maiafur haing and Market Courts Sardinian Majesty, being conducted to Court in the Marquess del Borgo's Coach. The 27th be-ing the Prince of Piedmont's Birth-Day, his Royal Highnefs received the Compliments of the Nobility. In the Evening there was a fplendid Ball at Court, and laft Night an Opera was per-formed there. His Sardinian Majefty having declared, that in Confideration of the happy Marriage of the Prince of Piedmont, he will give all devout Roman Catholicks the Satisfaction of adoring the holy Handkerchief, a famous Relick kept here; it is accordingly to be exposed to publick View on the 4th of May, when a great Con-course of People is expected from the neighbouring Countries, to be prefent at that religious So lemnity, in which feven Bishops are to officiate.

Turin, May 2, N. S. On the 30th paft the Bifhops had Audiences in form of their Sardinian Majeities, to congratulate them upon the Marriage of the Prince of Piedmont. Scaffolds are raifing round the Court of the Palace, and round the Place Chateau, for the Convenience of those who intend to join in the Adoration of the Santo Su-dario (or Holy Hankershief) which is to be expoled with great Solemnity on Monday the 4th Inftant. The Counts di Belgioiolo and the Count Arconati the Milaneze Deputies, were on the 30th past carried to fee the Veneria, where the Marquel's de Baranger, by Order from the King, attended and treated them.

Dantzick, April 29. We have Advice from Mofcow, that the Czar continues there, but that he has refolved upon an Expedition towards the Cafpian Sea, and will go himfelf to command in Perfon the chief Body of Forces to be employed in it. The Troops already marching for this Service, are The Troops already marching for this Service, are 13000 regular Foot, and 8000 Dragoons, under General Allart: They will be transported by Sea; in order to which a number of Veifels is fitting out at Cafan and Aftracan with all Diligence, to be commanded by Admiral Apraxin: The Czar will go with them. They are to land in Schir-wan, a Province of Perfia, and are to make them-felves Mafters of Derbant, and of Schamachy the Canital a whereby they will fecure the Paffages Capital; whereby they will fecure the Paffages and open an easy Way to Chilan, another Pro-vince which by its Situation and Inclosure of Mountains is almost separated from the rest of Persia. At the fame Time, another Body of 40000 Men, to confist of 10000 Coffacks from the Don, 10000 from the Ukraine, 10000 Calmucks, and 10000 Baskiers and other Tartars, is to march from Aftracan by Land, to attack the Usbecks on the other fide; by which the Czar propofes to gain almost all the Borders of the Caspian Sea: He thinks to finish this Campaign in four Months,

and then to return to Moleow. Hague, May 12, N.S. M. Ganfinot, Refident both from the Elector of Bavaria and from the Prince of Bavaria Bishop of Munster, notified Yesterday to the States General the Advice he had received that Morning by an Express, that the faid.
