- (b) a variation from the said standard diameter of 0.125 millimetres per coin.
- (3) The variation from the standard weight will be measured as the average of a sample of not more than one kilogram of the coin.
- (4) The least current weight of the said gold coin shall be 1.56 grammes.
- (5) The design of the said gold coin shall be as follows:

- 7. (1) A new coin of silver of the denomination of one pound shall be made, being a coin of a standard weight of 15.64 grammes, a standard diameter of 27 millimetres, a standard composition of not less than 999 parts per thousand fine silver, and being circular in shape.
- (2) In the making of the said silver coin a remedy (that is, a variation from the standard weight or diameter specified above) shall be allowed of an amount not exceeding the following, that is to say:
- (a) a variation from the said standard weight of an amount per coin of 0.075 grammes;
- (b) a variation from the said standard diameter of 0.125 millimetres
- (3) The variation from the standard weight will be measured as the average of a sample of not more than one kilogram of the coin.
- (4) The design of the said silver coin shall be as follows:
- 'For the obverse impression Our effigy with the inscription "ELIZABETH · II · D · G REG · FID · DEF", and the value of " · 1 · POUND · ", and for the reverse the figure of Britannia standing upon a rock in the sea, her right hand grasping a trident and her left resting on a shield and holding an olive branch, with the inscription "BRITANNIA  $\cdot$  2013  $\cdot$  1/2  $\cdot$  OUNCE  $\cdot$  FINE  $\cdot$  SILVER  $\cdot$ ". The coin will have a graining upon the edge'.
- (5) The said silver coin shall be legal tender for payment of any amount in any part of Our United Kingdom.

8. (1) A new coin of silver of the denomination of fifty pence shall be made, being a coin of a standard weight of 7.83 grammes, a standard diameter of 22 millimetres, a standard composition of not less than 999 parts per thousand fine silver, and being circular in shape.

- (2) In the making of the said silver coin a remedy (that is, a variation from the standard weight or diameter specified above) shall be allowed of an amount not exceeding the following, that is to say:
- (a) a variation from the said standard weight of an amount per coin of 0.05 grammes;
- (b) a variation from the said standard diameter of 0.125 millimetres per coin.
- (3) The variation from the standard weight will be measured as the average of a sample of not more than one kilogram of coin.
- (4) The design of the said silver coin shall be as follows
- For the obverse impression Our effigy with the inscription "ELIZABETH  $\cdot$  II  $\cdot$  D  $\cdot$  G REG  $\cdot$  FID  $\cdot$  DEF", and the value of "  $\cdot$  50  $\cdot$  PENCE  $\cdot$ ", and for the reverse the figure of Britannia standing upon a rock in the sea, her right hand grasping a trident and her left resting on a shield and holding an olive branch, with the inscription "BRITANNIA · 2013 · · 1/4 · · OUNCE · FINE · SILVER ·". The coin will have either:
- (a) graining upon the edge, or
- (b) a plain edge with the incuse inscription "SS GAIRSOPPA".

## TWENTY PENCE COIN

- 9. (1) A new coin of silver of the denomination of twenty pence shall be made, being a coin of a standard weight of 3.15 grammes, a standard diameter of 16.50 millimetres, a standard composition of not less than 999 parts per thousand fine silver, and being circular in
- (2) In the making of the said silver coin a remedy (that is, a variation from the standard weight or diameter specified above) shall be allowed of an amount not exceeding the following, that is to say:
- (a) a variation from the said standard weight of an amount per coin of 0.03 grammes;
- (b) a variation from the said standard diameter of 0.125 millimetres per coin.
- (3) The variation from the standard weight will be measured as the average of a sample of not more than one kilogram of coin.
- (4) The design of the said silver coin shall be as follows:
- 'For the obverse impression Our effigy with the inscription "ELIZABETH  $\cdot$  II  $\cdot$  D  $\cdot$  G REG  $\cdot$  FID  $\cdot$  DEF", and the value of "  $\cdot$  20  $\cdot$  PENCE  $\cdot$ ", and for the reverse the figure of Britannia standing upon a rock in the sea, her right hand grasping a trident and her left resting on a shield and holding an olive branch, with the inscription "BRITANNIA · 2013 · · 1/10 · · OUNCE · FINE · SILVER · ". The coin will have a graining upon the edge'.

# TEN PENCE COIN

- 10. (1) A new coin of silver of the denomination of ten pence shall be made, being a coin of a standard weight of 1.58 grammes, a standard diameter of 12 millimetres, a standard composition of not less than 999 parts per thousand fine silver, and being circular in shape.
- (2) In the making of the said silver coin a remedy (that is, a variation from the standard weight or diameter specified above) shall be allowed of an amount not exceeding the following, that is to say:
- (a) a variation from the said standard weight of an amount per coin of 0.02 grammes;
- (b) a variation from the said standard diameter of 0.125 millimetres
- (3) The variation from the standard weight will be measured as the average of a sample of not more than one kilogram of coin.
- (4) The design of the said silver coin shall be as follows:
- For the obverse impression Our effigy with the inscription "ELIZABETH  $\cdot$  II  $\cdot$  D  $\cdot$  G REG  $\cdot$  FID  $\cdot$  DEF", and the value of "  $\cdot$  10  $\cdot$  PENCE  $\cdot$ ", and for the reverse the figure of Britannia standing upon a rock in the sea, her right hand grasping a trident and her left resting on a shield and holding an olive branch, with the inscription "BRITANNIA · 2013 · · 1/20 · · OUNCE · FINE · SILVER · ". The coin will have a graining upon the edge'.
- 11. This Proclamation shall come into force on the eleventh day of July Two thousand and thirteen.
