#### Madrid, May 3. N. S.

HE Marquels de Grimaldo Secretary in of State, has by Order and in the Name of his Catholick Majefty affured Mr. Stanhope the Brijith, Ambaffadour at this Gourt, that the naval Armament which is now making in some of the Ports of Spain, shall not be employed in any Expedition contrary to the Engagements between this Crown and that of Great Britain.

Paris, May 11, N. Sa All the Irifh Regiments which were quartered near the Coafts of this Kingdom, are removed up into the Inland Parts of the Country by Order of the Duke Regent : And express Orders have been issued, forbidding any Perlon to go over from France into Great Britain, without a Palsport from the Court.

Paris, May 11, N. S. The following Advices received by the Court relating to the Plague, have been communicated to the foreign Minifters.

The Bifhop, the Governout, and the Ayde Major of Alais, in their Letters of the 20th and 21ft of April write, that a Child of five Years old falling fick in the City, died tour Hours after it was removed to the Infirmary : Upon this it was judged proper to capfe the Goods of the Houle where it fickened to be burnt, and to put under Quarantain without the Town thole who lived in that Houle. Notwithflanding which is was believed the Plague had intigely cealed there, this Accident having not had any Confequence. The Duke de Roquelaure in his of the 22d writes the fame thing, and adds that the Perfons put under The Duke de Quarantain, who were eight in Number, were yet in perfect Health, that there was no Proof of their having had any Communication with the Child, and that in all likelihood the Poverty and Uncleanliness of the Parents occasi. oned the Accident. M. de Bernage in his of the 22d, gives the fame Account from Alais. There had not been any fick at Mende fince Palm-Sunday. Nor any at St. Leger for above a Month. Nor at Greze and Montodat for 12 of 15 Days. Nor at Molines in 50. Nor at Chambonet and le Buirfon for near a Month. La Canourgue has one or more taken fick from Time to Time. In all the other Places there are nove fick. M. de Rambion writes the 21ft of April, that three Children had died at Lanrac, that their Mother was fallen fick, but that it was hoped the Precautions taken would prevent any Confquences. A young Woman who died some Days before at Fraffinet was thought to have had the Plague ; but nothing ill from it had bappened there fince. St. Genaix and its Blockade were in a good State of Health ; there remained but one fick, who was recovering. The Chevalier Damas in his was recovering. The Chevalier Damas in Dis of the 21ft and 24th gives an Account that he had made a Tour with the Duke de Roque-laure, by the Way of St. Elprit, Beaucaire, and other Places to Nilmes; and affirms the Diftemper is ceasing in the Sevennes, the Gevandan, and the Vivarais. No more than two fick remained in all, the infected

Country, one at Laurac and the other at Mende. The Chevalier d'Aiguilhe, in his of the 22A and 23d, fendethe Copy of a Letter from the Syndick of the Gevaudan, who confirms the good State of Health of that Country.

Provence. M. de Belticu in his of the 26th of April writes, that the Accident at Marfeilles had not had any ill Confequences. M. de Pilles Commandant at Marseilles, in his of the 21ft of April, affures us that Town is in perfect Health, and that the Blockade of Alauch was intirely railed, and the Troops all with-drawn. M. le Bret in his of the 20th fays, he had received the fame Day a Letter from the Sheriffs of Marscilles, importing that the Town and its Infirmaries were in perfect Health. The Marquels de Braocas in his of the 22d of April, gives the same Account from Matseilles, and says he was perswaded they had taken a falle Alarm thère.

M. de Saffelange writes the 24th, that fince the 15th there was an open Communication at Avignon, that no more than one or two a Day fell fick there, and that it was believed the Diftemper was ceafing. The The Com. reft of the Comtat was very well, miffary Ruelle writes the 25th, that the Re-port which had been spread some Days, that Perfons were newly feized with the Contagion at Orange, was without Foundation.
