bouring Countries, however, those of the Facti n arconfiantinople, continue in the mean time as firong and resolute as ever, and have not by all the perswasions and practices of the Grand Visier, been hitherto to be wrought upon in order to the submitting themselves to the Grand Signior.

Cavag. er Quirini is at length departed hence on his Emba. y to the Port, whither he was the more hastened in regard of the approaching winter, and his own indisposition, which would hardly have permitted him to undertake the journey but in a fair Season. Here is lately arrived General Barbar from Dalmatio, having heen received by the District and Senate with all imaginable kindness and esteem; it is said, that General Morosini who succeeded him in Dalmatia, finding his indisposition to grow dayly upon him, hath desired of the Senate that he may be recalled from that Government.

From Procurator Nani we have advice, of the frequent conferences he hath with the Turks, for the adjusting the matter of the Limits, bidding ushope, that all things may suddainly come to the defired conclusion, notwithstanding the Turks express no great readiness to determine this affair, on those equal terms we had at first promised our selves. General Bernardo is recalled home, and expected here in three weeks. Here is likewise in Town General Spare; it is said, that the Pension he formerly received of 5000 Dücats per annum from this Republick, is to be for the suture discontinued, as well in consideration of his being entred into the Emperors service; as of the present Peace this State enjoys.

It is said, that the Senate hath given orders to their Officers in the Arsenal, to set all hands atwork for the providing 50 good Ships for Trade, to be employed by a Company of Marchants, who are to be incorporated here by the name of the Levant Company, to which end, many are already come in, and have subscribed for considerable summing towards a general Stock. From Rome they write, to feveral Prodigies which have lately happened there, not without leaving a general sear and confirmation on the hearts of the ordinary people, who are apt to ominate from thence some great accidents to follow.

Brunswick, August 29. The Duke of Wolfembutel is at present here, setting all hands at work for the raising the new Cittadel he intends to make. We have at present 4000 Men in Garrison, notwithstanding our Duke hath lately for the ease of the Inhabitants disbanded one of the Regiments' which was lodged in this place.

Cologne, September 1. Here is lately arrived 250 Men more from several places hereabouts, raised by Commission from the Marquis de Grana, so that his Regiment is now very near compleated. Bishop of Strasburgh, as likewise Prince William of Furstembergh, are at present at Breuil, where there are dayly held several conferences, between the Deputies of the respective Mediators, concerning the affairs of this place. On Sunday last two of our Burgemasters, together with the Envoy from the Elector of Brandenburgh, went likewise thither to see what may be done for the composing of these matters, though there seems but little likelyhood of any bet ter inceels then formerly, by reason our Elector, as we are told, perfists still to have several persons delivered up to him, which this Townhath declared they can never do. We dayly expect here several Deputies from the Circle of Westphilia.

of Cel and Hanouer, with several of the Danish Nobility and persons of quality arrived at Altena, where they were received with all the Solemuity the place could afford; This day they part again on their way to Harburgh, where the preparations for their reception are very extraordinary.

Hague, September 8. Yesterday morning went hence the Heer d' Amerongen for Cologne, where he is to endevor on the part of these States, together with the Deputies of the respective Mediators that are at present there, to bring things to a good understanding; our Letters from thence speak not of any alteration of late in the affairs of that place; that Elector continues with the Bishop of Strasburgh and the Prince of Furstembergh at Breuil, taking the divertisement of hunting: Several proposals have been lately made, as we are told, in order to an accommodation, of the fuccels of which, we cannot but very much doubt as long as that Elector persists in several demands, which the Town is of mind never to consent to; amongst which, that concerning the delivering up certain of the Inhabitants is one of the first.

We very earnestly expect the coming together of the States of Holland, when it is thought several-matters that have been so long in debate, and which have occasioned so much discourse, may at length be concluded. By Letters from our Fleet, we have advice, that all things were in a good contion there, that they keep still their former Station, plying to and fro upon the Coast of Zealand, but that their Admiral intended in respect of the seafon, to put out somewhat farther to Sea.

The Spanish Envoy Extraordinary Don Emanuel de Lyra, having performed the Ceremonies of his first Audience, and received and returned the several visits, as well of the Forreign Ministers, as where persons of quality here, is entring upon his Negotiation, having to that end had Commissioners appointed him by the States General. On Thursday, last arrived here the Heer Heuch, Envoy Extraoradinary from the Crown of Denmark from South-Holland, whither he went the week before out of euriosity to see those parts.

Brussels, September 9. On Friday last his Excellency the Count de Monterey went hence for Leeuwes, to visit the Fortifications of that place, and returned hither again that Evening. It is said, that his Excellency hath been somewhar distatisted which the Governor of Ipre, upon what hath lately happened at Warneton, and that he hath written to him to express his resentment of his proceeding in the matter.

It is said here, the Heer Lieutenant Admiral vant Ghent, is to go with a Squadron of men of Wart towards the Coasts of Spaine. As well here as an Ghent, Bruges and other places, the Fortification ons are carried on with all the vigor imaginable, all the Inhabitants as well Ecclesiatical as others working dayly on them, so that we doubt not but to see them every where sinished yet before the win-
