N the 19th Inftant the following humble Address was presented to His Majefty by the Deputy-Lieutenants of the Tower Hamlets, being introduced by the Right Honourable the Lord Carteret one of His Majefty's Principal Secretaries of State.

To the King's most Excellent Majesty,

The humble Address of the Deputy-Lieutegants of the Tower-Hamlets.

Molt Gracious Sovereign,

WE your Majefty's moß faithful and loyal Subjects, being whus permitted to apptoach your Royal Throne, beg Leave to declare our just Abhorence of that wicked Confpiracy which feveral of your Majefty's Subjects, contrary to their Allegiance, have entred into, in Concert with Traitors Abroad, for raifing a Rechellion in favour of a Popifh Pretender, and to overthrow our excellent Confitution in Church and State.

This traiterous Defign being fo early difcovered, is a fresh Instance of your great Wildom to prevent the dismal Calamities which would neceffarily attend such howid Rebellion; and we cannot express the Happiness of your faithful Subjects under the Administration of so gracious a Prince, always watchful for the good and lasting Welfare of his People. Your Majesty's frequent Clemency, even to your worst Enemies, might demand a suitable Return of grateful Submission; but these restless Spirits cannot be fatisfied with the Peace and Plenty they might enjoy, while the benign Influence of your mild Government extends to the utmost Limits of your Kingdoms, and to every Subject therein.

As we are armed by the Laws of the Land, and the Authority of your Majefty's Commiffion, we are firmly refolved to exert our felves in your Majefty's Service, and to be vigilant in lupprefing all tomultuous Affemblies and siofous Perfons, who shall dare to disturb your Majesty's Peace, violate the Honour, and hazard the Safety of your facred Perfon and Royal Family, the great Defence and Bulwark, under divine Providence, of our seligious and civil Liberties, with all that is valuable and dear to us.

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And we beg Leave to affure your Majefty, that we shall always effect our felves obliged to maintain and defend your rightful and lawful Title to the Crown of these Realms, to the utmost of our Power, against all the fearet and open Attempts of a Popish or Rebellious Faction, which would turn our happy Constitution, Ecclefiastical and Civil, into Tyranny and Superstition.

That your Majefty, the beft of Kings, may be long preferved, by divine Protection, for the Safety and Profperity of your faithful People; and that the like Bleffings may be conveyed down to the Jateft Pofterity, by Princes descending from you, and inheriting your Majefty's Royal Virtues, is the hearty Prayer,

May it pleafe your Majefty, of your Majefty's most dutiful and most obedient Subjects.

To which His Majefty was pleafed to return the following most gracious Answer.

I Thank you for this dutiful and loyal Address, and am fully perswaded of your Zeal and Affettion for my Person and Government.

After which they had all the Honour to kife His Majefty's Hand: And His Majefty was pleafed to confee the Honour of Knighthood on Daniel Dolios and Ifaac Tillard, Efges two of the faid Deputy-Lieutenants.

Constantinople, April 3. Nothing of publick Concern has lately passed here, unless it be a Difficulty brought upon the Latin or Roman-Catholick Church in the Island of Scio, on this Occasion. During the War in 1694 the Venetians took that Island, and the Turks retook it the The Year Following : The Greeks who are always at Variance with the Latins, made use of that Opportunity to drive the latter out of the Island, by representing to the Turks that they gave Intelligence to, and fecretly favoured, the Venetians in that Enterprize. Thereupon all the Latin Churches were demolifhed, and the Romifh Priefts fent away. Since that Time fome of them have returned and continued there by Connivance, without any publick Church ; but Count Virmont the Imperial Minister, during his Embasily, obtained Leave for them to rebuild one ; and the French Ambasiladour has affilted them, in getting Leave for the Jesuites and Capuchins to build Places to read the Golpel in (so they term their Religions Worship) without giving them the Names of Churches. This Licence they have carried on to an Excels, not only building more of those Places of Worship than were allowed, but pretending lately to disposses a Turk of a House and Land, which, though formerly belonging to the Capuchins, were given to him by the Frand Sionior upon their Expulsion. The Grand Signior upon their Expulsion. Turks enraged at this, role in Arms, demolifhed the new Churches that were built, put in Pri-Ton the Litin Bishops and Monks who were found on the Island, and have sent up to the Port great Complaints against them and their The French Ambaffadour, who Behaviour. imputes this Accident to the indifcreet Zeal of the Priests there, is endeavouring to make up the Matter, which will certainly coft a good Sum of Money; but it is doubted whether he will be able to get things fettled upon fo good a Foot for them as before, because the Greeks who are more rich and powerful, will open their Purses too on this Occasion, and are more favoured by the Turks than the Latins, whom they look upon to be more dependent on Chriftian Princes.
