1. NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the London Borough of Ealing Council, in connection with the creation of the Old Oak controlled parking zone V V, propose to make the above-mentioned Orders under sections 6, 45, 46, 49 and 124 of and Part IV of Schedule 9 to the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 as amended by the Local Government Act 1985.

2. The general effect of the Ealing (Old Oak Zone V V) (Residents Parking Places) Order 200* would be to:

(a) introduce parking places for the use of residents, their visitors and business users in lengths of Goodhall Street – between Old Oak Lane and Stephenson Street, Midland Terrace, Old Oak Lane (a) the northwest side between Fisherman's Arms and No. 78 Old Oak Lane and (b) the south-east side between No. 22 and No. 49 Old Oak Lane and Shaftesbury Gardens;

(b) allow permit holders only to park between the hours of 10am and 11am and between 3pm and 4pm on Mondays to Fridays inclusive in any part of the following roads (except in disabled parking places and areas marked by double yellow lines) where it does not cause obstruction to other traffic: Goodhall Street – between Stephenson Street and Channel Gate Street and Stephenson Street

(c) provide that the parking places would operate between the hours of 10am and 11am and between 3pm and 4pm on Mondays to Fridays inclusive; and

(d) provide that passenger vehicles, goods carrying vehicles, motorcycles and disabled persons vehicles may be left in a parking place without limitation on time during the controlled hours and that with the exception of motorcycles and disabled persons vehicles, a valid V V zone permit or voucher must be displayed whilst parked therein.

3. The general effect of the Telephone Parking Order would be to

(a) introduce "shared use/telephone" parking place operating between the hours of 9.00 am and 5.00 pm on Mondays to Fridays inclusive in lengths of Goodhall Street, Midland Terrace and Shaftesbury Gardens;

(b) provide that passenger vehicles, goods carrying vehicles, motorcycles and disabled persons vehicles may be left in the parking places and that with the exception of motorcycles and disabled persons vehicles, a valid V V zone permit must be displayed or payment made by mobile phone using the telephone payment parking system operated by RingGo whilst parked in the parking place;

(c) provide that the charges for parking in the "shared use/telephone" parking place would be $\pounds 2$ per day and there will be a 20 pence transaction charge payable to the service provider;

(d) Users of the telephone payment system should follow the instructions displayed in the parking place quoting the unique number relating to that parking place to the service provider and providing information as requested. Payment of the parking charge can then be made using most debit and credit cards.
