HIGHWAYS ACT 1980

THE GWYNEDD COUNCIL (CONSTRUCTION OF PONT TONFANNAU) SCHEME 2012

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the Welsh Ministers have confirmed the above Scheme, which was made by Gwynedd Council under section 106(3) of the Highways Act 1980. As confirmed, the Scheme authorises the Council to provide an equestrian bridge, which incorporates a footpath and a cycleway, across the River Dysynni from Sandilands Road, Tywyn to Tonfannau, Gwynedd.

The scheme commences from a point on the north bank of the River Dysynni estuary whose coordinates are 256661E, 302898N and terminates at a point on the south bank whose coordinates are 256687 E, 302944 N. Ordnance Survey Map reference SH50SE. The bridge will occupy the approximate position of the old Army Bailey Bridge which was domeliated in the late 70c early 80c. which was demolished in the late 70s early 80s.
