However, the Precautions were continued for preventing the Accidents which might happen by the Heats. He had raifed the Blockade of Salindres, where all the Ougrantains and the Diffuefetion had been fipers. all the Quarantains and the Difinfection had been fi-nifhed two Months before. Cornillon was likewife free from all Sufpicion of the Plague. A young Wo-man who had been ill at Colias was cured, having had only an ordinary Tumour. The Duke de Roque-
