An humble Address of the Mayor, Recorder, Aldermen, Common Council, Freemen, and Inhabitants of the City of Rochester, has been presented to His Majesty by Sir John Jennings one of their Representatives in Parliament, introduced by the Right Honourable the Lord Viscount Townshend one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State.

Which Addresses His Majesty was pleased to receive very graciously.

Madrid, June 1, N. S. The Viscount de Miralcazar, Major General, is appointed to com-

mand the Forces quartered in the Neighbourhood of Gibraltar, in the Room of the Marquess de Pozoblanco. The Marquess de Monte Alegre died suddenly the 15th past, he was Groom of the Stole to his Catholick Majesty, and Captain of the Company of Halbardiers-Guards; he is succeeded in his Estate and Title of Grandee by the Marquess de Quintana his Son. The King and Queen with the Royal Family will come hither To-morrow from Aranjuez, in order to assist at the usual Procession, on Corpus Christi Day: After six Days stay here they will go to Balsain for a Month, and then remove to the Escorial: The Prince and Princess of Asturias will remain here till the Court is settled at the Escorial, and then go thither. The Employments vacant by the Death of the Marquess de Monte Alegre are not yet disposed of, but the King has ordered the Count de Penaranda first Gentleman of his Bedchamber to officiate as Groom of the Stole. The Marquess de Casafuerte, lately appointed Viceroy of Mexico, is arrived at Cadiz, whence he will put to Sea very soon with the Azogues or Quicksilver Ships for New Spain.

Turin, June 6, N. S. The Prince of Mafferan with his two Brothers arrived here some Days ago from Spain. He went from hence very young in the Service of the King of Sardinia's Daughter on her Marriage to his Catholick Majesty, and continued twenty Years in Spain, where he has made a considerable Fortune, having been advanced to the Rank of a Lieutenant-General, made a Grandee of Spain, and Knight of the Golden Fleece: His Father died here some Months ago, from whom he inherits the Title of Prince of Mafferan, which is an Ecclesiastical Fief situate between Piemont and the State of Milan. The Evening when the Court arrived at the Veneria, Count Galliani who has a House in that Neighbourhood, made a very fine Illumination and Fireworks, to welcome the Princess on her first coming to that Place. On the 30th past the Portuguese Cardinal d'Aconha arrived here from Rome with a numerous Retinue, designing to go to Paris and other Towns of France in his way Home.

On the 1st Instant he went to the Veneria to wait on their Sardinian Majesties. The 3d the King and Court came to Town, his Majesty made the Cardinal the Compliment to shew him the Santo Sudorio, after which he returned the same Day to the Venetia. On the 4th the Cardinal went to the Veneria to take Leave of the Court, and the same Evening set forward on his Journey.

Paris, June 17, N. S. On the 15th Instant after Dinner, the King set out from hence in his Coach for Versailles, being accompanied by the Duke Regent, the Duke of Chartres, the Duke of Bourbon, the Count de Clermont, and the Marshal de Villeroy; the chief Officers of the Household followed in several Coaches. A Detachment of the Guards attending on this Occasion, went as far as Seve, and another to Versailles; each Detachment consisting of two Brigades of the Life-Guards, two Brigades of the Guard of Gendarmes, two Brigades of the Light Horse, two Brigades of the Grey and two of the Black Mousquetaires, with their Officers. His most Christian Majesty at his alighting from his Coach, went to Prayers in the Chapel, whence he went up to his Apartments and took some Refreshment, then viewed the other Apartments, and afterwards walked in the little Park. Versailles being the Place of his Majesty's Birth, the Inhabitants of that Town made great Rejoycings, and had Te Deum sung in their Parish Church, for his coming to reside there. This Afternoon the Infanta Queen sets out for Versailles. The Duke Regent intends to come from thence by a Weekly every Thursday Morning after the King's Levee, and to go back the Friday Evening. Last Sunday Night M. de Montecuir one of the Gentlemen of the King's Bedchamber went to the Duke de Noailles at St. Germain en Laye, and delivered to him a Lettre de Cachet ordering him to retire to Auvergne, which he obeyed the next Morning. By another Order the Marquess de Canillac was commanded to retire fifty Leagues from Paris. Last Monday Morning the Prince of Chimay was married to a Daughter of the Duke of St. Simon in the Chapel of Meudon. The States of Britany will assemble at Nantes the Beginning of next Winter; the Marshal d'Estrees will sit there as the King's Commissioner, the Prince de Leon as President of the Noblesse, and the Bishop of Nantes as Principal of the Clergy. M. de Castelas Lieutenant-General, Lieutenant-Collonel of the Swiss Guards, and Collonel of the Swiss Regiment of his Name, died some Days ago. The 12th at Night he was interred at St. Roche his Parish Church, 400 Men of the Swiss Guards and 200 of the other Guards, with all the Officers, appeared at his Funeral. The Marquess de St. Herant Governour of Fontainebleau, is likewise dead, his second Son who had the Reversion of that Employment succeeds him.

Stockholm, May 30, O. S. Monday last being the King of Great Britain's Birthday, Mr.

Finch His Majesty's Minister at this Court, entertained on that Occasion at Dinner, the Senators and Foreign Ministers; and in the Evening there was a Ball, and a very fine Collation: There was a very great Appearance of both Sexes. About 10 a-Clock at Night the King of Sweden himself, in Compliment to the Day, was pleased to honour Mr. Finch with his Presence. His Majesty came as incognito, to avoid Ceremony, with a very few Attendants; was received at alighting from his Coach by Mr. Finch, and conducted into the great Hall where the Company was dancing: From whence his Majesty proceeded likewise into the other Apartments, and was pleased to be a Spectator of the different Diversions the several Companies were engaged in. Many Healths were drank during his Majesty's Stay, as, that of the King of Great Britain, the King and Queen of Sweden, their Royal Highnesses the Prince and Princess of Wales, and the Royal Family of Great Britain; his Highness the Landgrave, and the illustrious Family of Hesse Cassel: Those of the King of Great Britain, the Prince and Princess of Wales, and Royal Family of Great Britain, being particularly begun by the King of Sweden; as were the other by Mr. Finch. His Majesty was pleased to stay till about Twelve a-Clock, and was then re-conducted to his Coach by Mr. Finch. It is said the King of Sweden will make a Tour into Schonen about a Fortnight hence; and that the Queen will go at the same Time to drink the Waters at Medewi.

Whitehall, June 18. This Morning about Four a-Clock died at Windsor the most Noble John Duke of Marlborough, Captain-General of His Majesty's Forces, Master-General of the Ordnance, Knight of the most Noble Order of the Garter, &c. whose great and successful Actions in the Service of his Country, will transmit his Name with Glory to all Posterity.
