**A**N humble Address of the Bailiffs, Aldermen, and Burgeses, of the Corporation of East Retford in the County of Nottingham, has been presented to His Majesty by his Grace the Duke of Newcastle Lord Chamberlain of His Majesty's Household, and High Steward of the Corporation of East Retford.

Constantinople, May 12. The Latin Bishop and six Monks are brought hither from Scio,

to answer for the Disorder which happened in that Island on Account of their building of Churches. They are not only put in Chains among the common Slaves, but also ordered out with them (the Bishop as well as the rest) to work every Day at the Walls of Constantinople, which the Grand Signior is now repairing. The Bishop has been told, that, if he and his Monks will have their Liberty they must pay sixty Purfes for it, 50 to the Grand Vizier, and 10 to the Captain Pasha, each Purfe valued at 100 l. Sterling. To this the Bishop answered, that he and his Monks had no Money, nor Power to raise any; but that, if the Grand Signior would have such a Sum, it could be levied only by his Authority, by taxing each Latin or Roman Catholick of the Island according to his Ability, and forcing them to the Payment. It is said the Port has agreed to this Expedient, and the Business is adjusted upon that Foot. We have had no News of the Turkish Fleet since the ten Men of War sailed from hence; nor do we hear that Janom Choggia who is to command it, is yet arrived at Scio: However, People continue to be of Opinion, that the Design is upon the Island of Gozo.

On Friday last Sir John Blencowe, Kt. one of the Justices of His Majesty's Court of Common Pleas, surrendered his said Office, and Yesterday Mr. Serjeant Denton was Sworn in his Room.

Whitehall, April 16, 1722.

This is to signify in His Majesty's Name, that if any Person or Persons shall hereafter apprehend any one or more Highwaymen, who from and after the Date hereof shall have robbed any of the Mails, or shall have been concerned as Accomplices in the robbing of any of them, such Person or Persons shall have a Reward of Two Hundred Pounds for each Offender, who shall be convicted thereof, to be paid by the Receiver General of the Post-Office, over and above the Reward directed by Act of Parliament for apprehending of Highwaymen; or if any Person hereafter concerned in robbing any of the Mails shall make a Discovery of the same, so that his Accomplice or Accomplices shall be convicted thereof, such Person shall have His Majesty's most gracious Pardon, and also receive the Reward of Two Hundred Pounds for each Offender so convicted, to be paid as aforesaid.
