A PROCLAMATION,

Requiring Paffes formerly granted to Ships and Veffels trading in the Way of the Algerine Cruizers, to be returned 10to the Office of the Admiralty of Great Britain; and other Paffes to be iffued of a New Form.

GEORGE R.

WHereas by our Royal Proclamation bearing Date the Fourth Day of October, in the Eirft Year of our Reign, we did Charge and Requires, what the Owners and Masters of all Ships and Voffels belonging to our loving Subjetts of Great Britain and Irolands as well as our Foreign Governments and Plantations, which should have Occasion to trade to Portugal, the Canaries, Guinea, the Indies, into the Mediterranean, or elfewhere, in the Way of the Cruizers of the Government of Algier, should be furnished with Passes of the Form thereby di refted, by or before the Thirtieth Day of July, in the Year of our Lord One thousand seven fundred and fifteen. And whereas our Commissioners for Executing the Office of High Admiral of Great Britain and iredand, have humbly represented anto is, that it may have happened, that when such Ships of Vesses have either been taken in Time of War, or disposed of by Sale in remote Parts, the Pass is jued to them, as aforefaid, may have fallen into the Hands of Foreigners, or have been fold to them with the Ships or Vesses, the latter being direstly contrary to the Bonds entred into by the Masters of fuch Ships and Vesses to return the aforefaid Pass, that so they may be Cancelled at the Admirality Office : And our faid Commissioners for Executing the Office of High Admiral of Great Britain and iredand, have hambly represented anto the Hands of Foreigners, or have been fold to them with the Ships or Vesses to return the aforefaid Pass, that so they may be Cancelled at the Admirality Office : And our faid Commissioners for Executing the Office of High Admiral of Great Britain and Ireland, having further represented un-

to us, that they have been informed, that several Ships and Veffels, belonging to Foreign Princes or States, have by fome indirect. Means procured and carried on their Trade with fuch Paffes, as afore-faid; which indirect Proceedings are not only prejudical to our Trading Subjetts, and our Revenue, but may occafion Mifunderstandings between us and the aforefaid Government of Algier : For preven-ting whereof we have thought fit, by the Advice of our Privy-Council, to publish this our Royal Pro-clamation, hereby declaring, that all such Passes of the Old Form, which have been iffued before the Date of this our Royal Proclamation, shall not continue in Force longer than for the Space of Twelve Months from the Date hereof (excepting fuch as have been granted to fuch Ships or Vessels as are gone or going to the East Indies, or to the South-Seas, or any other long Trading Voyages.) And we do hereby striftly Charge and Command all our And loving Subjects, who are, or fall be posselled of any such Passes, that they do, within the Space of Twelve Months from the Date of this our Royal Proclamation, as aforefaid, return the fame (ex-cepting fuch as before excepted) into the Office of the Admirality of Great Britain, in order to their being Cancelled; and that they do furnish themfelves with Paffes of a New Form, under the Hands, and Seals of our Commissioners for Executing the Office of High Admiral of Great Britain and Ire-land, in lieu thereof, for their feveral Ships and W. C. Veffels, according to the Treaties concluded between us and the faid Government of Algier, and our Instruttions given to our faid Commissioners for Execa-ting the Office of High Admiral of Great Britain and Ireland touching the fame.
