Cambray, Aug. 10, N. S. The Commandeur M. Delaval, who is charged with the Affairs of the Order of Malta at the Congress here, has received a Letter from Malta giving an Account, that on the 3d of July five Turkish Sultanas, or Ships of War, appeared before that Place, and the Commanding Officer sent in a Letter to the Great Master, requiring him to deliver up all the Mahometan Slaves, and to send an Answer to Tunis. Those Ships cruized in Sight of the Town two Days, and then went away. The Letter adds, that if they teturned they would find the Island in a good Posture of Desence.

Paris, Aug 12, N.S. His Excellency the Lord Whitworth, Ambassadour Extraordinary and Plenipotentiary from the King of Great Britain to the Congress of Cambray, arrived here last Night.
