PROCLAMATION,

For Apprehending John Sample, alias Semple.

GEORGE R.

WHereas John Sample, alias Semple, being in Custody, by Virtue of a Warrant of one of our Principal Secretaries of State, for High Treason, our rrincipal Secretaries of State, for High Ireafon, made his Efcupe from he Houfe of Daniel Mol-loy, one of our Meffengers in Ordinary, in the Great Almonary in Weftminster, on Sunday the Fifth Instant, about eight of the Clock in the Evening, and is fled from Justice: We have therefore thought fit, by the Advice of our Privy Council, to iffue this our Royal Procla-mation, bereby requiring and commanding -11 mation, hereby requiring and commanding all our loving Subjetts whatfoever, to difcover and apprehend, and canfe the faid John Sample (who is a Young Man, Middle-fized, baving a longifh Face very little marked with the Small Pox, and freckled, Grey Eyes, a Nofe forewhat High and Aquiline, his Eye-lafbes White, in-clining to Red, bis Eye-brows and Hair Red, well floaped, rather Lean, having on a Light Wig, and a Grey Coat trimmed with Black) to be apprehended and diffeovered, and to carry him before some of our Justices of the Peace, or Chief Magistrates of the County, Town, or Place, where he shall be apprehended; who are respettively required to secure him, and thereof to give speedy Notice unto our Privy-Council, or one of our Principal Secretaries of State, to the End he may be forth-coming, and be dealt withal, and proceeded againsft, according to Law. And whoever shall Apprehend or Discover the faid John Sample, and bring bim before fuch Justice of the Peace or Chief Magistrate, sball receive for Reward the Sum of One Thousand Pounds; which said Sum of One Thousand Pounds the Lords Commissioners of our Treasury

are hereby required and directed to pay accoraingly.

Given at our Court at Kensington, the Seventh Day of Angust, in the Ninth Year of our Reign, God fave the KING.
