### Cadiz, July 28, N. S.

UPON Information that there are fix Privateers of Algiers cruifing off Geno2, "and that they have taken feweral trading Veffels, the Spanish and Dutch Squadrons are gone in quest of them. The Spanish Gallies have carried into Tarisffa near Gibraltar, a Sallee Row-Boat with 33 Moors.

Paris, Aug. 19, N.S. On the 13th In-ftant, the Duke of Charoft was declared Go-vernour of the French King, in the Room of the Marshal de Villeroy. His Nomination to that Employment is generally approved, be-ing in great Reputation for Ability, Ho-nour, and Probity. He was formerly named for it by the late Duke of Burgundy this King's Father, and was now cholen by his Majefly out of the Lift of thole prefented to him by the Duke Regent. A Marriage is a-greed between the Infante Don Carlos bis Catholick Majefty's third Son, and Madamoiselle de Beaujolois the Regent's Daughter : Oo the 13th Inftant, bis Royal Highness came to Paris, to Compliment his Daughter upon this Occasion. On Sunday last the King accompanied by the Duke of Bourbon, the Count of Clermont, the Duke of Charoft his Gover nour, and the Duke de Villeroy Captain of the Life Guards in waiting, went from Versailles to St. Cloud, to Compliment Madamoiselle de Beaujolois on her Marriage. Letters from Rome of the 25th paft N. S. ad-vife, that upon Intelligence the Ottoman Fleet had left the Coast of Sicily and the Channel of Malta, and had made towards the Coast of Africa, the great Apprehensions they had been under of a Descent on the Coafts of the Ecclefiastical State had ceased. However a Draught had been ordered of ten

Men out of every Company of the Pope'a regular Forces, to ftrengthen the Garrilon of Civita Vecchia, and also to help to arm the Gallies there: Veletri was made a Place of Arms, and the Towers and Redoubts all along that Coaft, had their Garrilons reinforced by Militia of the Country. The following Extract of the Advices received by the Court relating to the Plague, has been communicated to the foreign Ministers.

The Dake de Roquelaure in his Letter of the 3d of August writes, that the general Quarantain bad not been interrupted any where, as far as to the 31st of July, by the Death or Sickness of any Person. M. de Rothe in bis of the 3d confirms, that all the Country within the Lines is in a good State of Health. M. le Bret in his of the 1st advises, that from the 27th of July to the 31ft, but one had died and three fallen fick at Marfeilles; no more than 37 remained fick there. M. Dorfas writes the 2d, that at the Tolling of all the Bells frict Quarantain was begun the 16th of July at Avignon; a third Part of the Inhabitants had left the Town; all Perfons were forbidden on Pain of Death to appear at their Doors, except the Commissatics and the Purveyors ; notwithflanding which fome Perfons who had broken that Order had been punished only by Whipping. Eighty Commissaries were appointed for the leveral Quarters of the Town, and each of them has under him three Purveyors to furnish all Necessaries. The Churches were open at Sarrians, The Prohibition of Communication with Caumont was taken off. Now and then some died still at Monteux. The Boils at Donzere had not had ill Effects. Orange and its Territory continued in a good State of Health : The Infirmaries were shut up : The Surgeons, Servants of the Infirmaries, and Buriers of the dead, were to be put under Quarantain affoon as the Perfuming and Airing of Goods

Goode was over: M. de Chabrillan in his of ! the 4th of August writes, that for 23 Days Donzere had been in a perfect State of Health.

Cambray, Aug. 18 N.S. The 12th Instant being the Anniverlary of His Britannick Majefty's Acceffion to the Crown, his Excellency the Lord Polwarth gave a very magnificent Entertainment to all the Foreign Ministers to fiding here. The Count and Countels of Windischgratz are returned hither from Paris.

All the R duc-d Office s now on Half Pay refiding in London and W. ftmir fter, or in the feveral Counties of Berks, Buckingbam, Bidford, Cambridge, Saulb-ampton, Hertford, Huntington, Kent, Leicefter, Middlefex, Northampon, Norfolk, Oxford, Surry, Suffix, Suf-folk, Wills, and Warwick, or any of them, before a Board confifting of General Officers and others appointed fr that Purpose, who will meet in the Great Room at the Horfe-Guards, on Tucfday the 14th of this Inftant August, and will sit there every Tuessay, Thursday, and Saturday, from and after the 13 b Day of August to the 1st Day of Suptember next, at Ten of the Clock in the Forenoon on each of the faid Days. All the Reduced Officers now on Half Pay residing in any Part of Wales, or in the Several Counties of Cornwall, Devon, Dorfet, Glouc fter, Her. ford, Monmouth, Salop, Semerfet, and Worcefter, or any of them, before the Honourable Bri-gadier General Stanwix at Briftol, between the 13th Day of August Instant, and the 3d Day of September following.
