**A**N humble Address of the Mayor, Recorder, Aldermen, Grand Jury, Sheriffs, and Citizens of the City of Limerick, assembled at a General Quarter-Sessions of the Peace held at the Tholsel of the said City on Thursday the 4th Day of October 1722, having been transmitted by the Lords Justices of Ireland to his Grace the Duke of Grafton Lord Lieutenant of that Kingdom, has by him been presented to His Majesty.

*Which Address His Majesty was pleased to receive very graciously.*

*Stockholm, Oct. 3.* The King of Sweden having finished the Review of the Life-Guards and other Troops which were ordered to make their Appearance last Week at Upsal, his Majesty went for two Days to the Palace of Ekolfund, and from thence went on Monday last to the Queen at Grypsholm. It is thought the Stay of the Court at that Palace will depend on the Goodness of the Weather. It is said the King has sent Orders for Summoning the States of the Kingdom to meet here in January next; and that Circular Letters are accordingly preparing to be sent to the respective Provinces for that Purpose.

*Stockholm, Oct. 10.* The Swedish Court continues still at Grypsholm, but are expected to return hither next Saturday. The King and Queen having met with the utmost Demonstrations of Duty and Affection at all the Towns through which they passed in their late Progress, Field-Marshal Taube Governour of this City, did therefore last Week move the Senate that publick Rejoicings might also be made at their Majesties Return hither; but the King having Notice of the Governour's Proposal, his Majesty sent hither last Saturday the younger Marshal Duben to acquaint

the Senate, that his Majesty would by no Means suffer the Town to be put to the Expence of receiving him with any Manner of Solemnity, and to forbid the making any Preparations for that Purpose. The Draught of the Circular Letter for convening the States of the Kingdom was laid before the Senate last Week, but some Debate arising about the Preamble, the issuing thereof is deferred till the King's Return.

*Hambourg, Oct. 30.* Letters from Moscow of the 5th Instant which arrived to Day, bring Advice, that a Courier dispatched thither by the Czar had given an Account, that Major-General Veteran with 2000 Men had made himself Master of a large Town called Andreowa where 6000 Tartars had fortified themselves and made a pretty good Defence, but were defeated. After this Action, Major-General Veteran advanced towards Derbent; whither the Czar was following him with his Army, accompanied by the Prince of Dagestan who had come in and submitted to him, and assured him those of Derbent would also submit to him.

*Hague, Oct. 30, N. S.* On the 28th Instant the States of the Province of Gelder being assembled, unanimously declared the young Prince of Nassau-Friseland Stadthouder and Captain-General and Admiral of that Province; and resolved to send a Deputation of some of their Members to Dieren to compliment the Prince thereupon, and to present his Commission to him.

*Whitehall, Oct. 27.* Thomas Duke of Norfolk having been taken into Custody was on the 25th Instant examined by a Committee of Lords of His Majesty's most Honourable Privy-Council, and was this Day committed Prisoner to the Tower for Suspicion of High Treason.

George Kelly having been examined Yesterday by the same Committee of Lords, is likewise committed Prisoner to the Tower for Suspicion of High Treason.
