'Madrid, Oltober 26, N. S.

HE Ship Cartmel, Captain Marshal Commander, belonging to fome British Merchants, having been fearched the last Year at Alicant by the Intendant there and he finding in her 6 or 7000 Pistoles, which had been put on board in Spain, confilcated the faid Ship and the whole Cargo for having that Money on board, and the Captain was condemned to Death; which Sentences were confirmed afterwards by the Council of the Treasury and also by the Council of War. But Collonel Stanhope His Britannick Majesty's Ambaffadour here, having by Order from the King his Mafter made Inftances to his Catholick Majefty, that the Execution of the faid Sentences might be suspended, and that cer tain Ministers of State might be appointed to re-examine that Affair, his Catholick Majefty having heard their Report, has annulled the faid Sentences, and ordered the intire and full Restitution of the faid Ship Cargo and Money to the faid Captain, with free Leave to proceed on his Voyage.

Paris, Nov. 11. The King accompanied by the Princes of the Blood, and the whole Court, returned on Sunday laft in the Evening to the Palace of the Thuilleries. Yefterday his Majefty went to Verfailles. Letters from Rome of the 24th paft advife, that the Ambaffadour of Malta had communicated to the Pope Letters which he had received from Malta dated September 29, giving an Account that two Ships, one from Athens the other from Smyroa, the latter having left that Place but 15 Days

befote, had brought Intelligence to the Great Master, that the Governours of all the Turkish Sea-Ports had received Orders from the Grand Signior to fend with all Expedition to Constantinople all the Mariners and Ship-Builders; that the Ottoman Fleet is to be increased to the Number of 60 Men of War, besides lighter Vessels and Transports, and is defigned (as was ge-nerally reported) to attack Malta next Spring. That from Smyrna, a confiderable Number of Seamen had actually been fent to Con-flantinople, and were to be followed spee-dily by a greater Number: And that the Bassa of Negropont had received Orders to get together all the Corn he could, to be ready for Transportation. At Malta great Application was uled in repairing and augmenting the Fortifications, and a Proclamation had been published, ordering every Inhabitant to have in his Houfe an Oven and a small Mill for grinding Corn into Meal, and to keep their Cisterns continually full of Water.

Cambray, Nov. 12, N. S. His Excellency the Lord Polwarth gave a very magnificent Entertainmest on the 10th Inflant, N. S. it being his Royal Highnels the Prince of Wales's Birth Day. All the Ambassadours and other Ministers were invited to it, with feveral other Persons of Note and Condition in this Town.

Stockholm, Off. 17, O. S. The King and Queen of Sweden returned hither on Saturday last in the Afternon. Count Taube, the Governour of the Town, defigned to have made Preparations for the receiving their Majesties, agreeably to what had been done at the feveral Places in their Progress; but the King expressly forbad any thing of that Nature,
