St. James's, November 16.

AN humble Address of the Governour and Council of the Province of the Massachusetts Bay in New-England, having been transmitted hither, has been presented to His Majesty by Jeremiah Dummer, Esq; Agent of that Province, introduced by the Right Honourable the Lord Carteret one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State.

Which Address His Majesty was pleased to receive very graciously.

Turin, Nov. 7. Last Saturday in the Night Madame Royale was taken ill of a Fever. On the Notice given to his Sardinian Majesty he arrived here on Sunday Morning at Break of Day, the Prince arrived in the Afternoon; on Monday Madame Royale being much better, his Majesty with the Prince returned to the Venetia. Tuesday being the Feast of St. Hubert the Patron of the Hunters, there was a general Stag hunting, at which his Majesty appeared with the Prince and several Noblemen all in new hunting Dresses: His Majesty treated in Publick all the Hunters that appeared that Day, and in the Evening returned to Turin, and the next Day to the Venetia.

Lisbon, Nov. 5, N. S. On the 22d past, the Cardinal d'Acunha arrived here from Rome, and was received by his Portuguese Majesty with singular Marks of Favour. His Britannick Majesty's Ship the Falmouth, is in this River preparing to sail in a few Days: On the 1st Instant arrived here the Solebay a British Man of War from Newfoundland, and she will very speedily proceed for the Downes. The three Maltese Men of War formerly mentioned to be here, went out of this Harbour on the 9th past, after having received a Present of 500 Barrels of Powder out of his Portuguese Majesty's Magazine. They were to cruise for some Days Northward as far as the Cape de Mondego on the Coast of this Kingdom, and then go up the Mediterranean. The Prince of Portugal sent them also great Quantities of Provisions of all Kinds, and their Ships were ordered to be repaired by Workmen from the King's Yards.

Gibraltar, Oct. 12, O. S. His Majesty's Ship the Dursley Galley came into this Bay two Days ago, and sailed this Day in order to joyn the Winchester and Lime Men of War, which are expected to come through the Streights. A

Spanish Man of War of 26 Guns came into this Bay Yesterday; the Captain says he left five more of that Squadron at the Back of the Hill, and says he is to joyn them as soon as the Wind will permit, and that their Orders are to cruise up the Streights.

Paris, Nov. 21. On the 19th Instant the Cardinal du Bois was elected a Member of the French Academy, by the whole Assembly unanimously. Yesterday in the Evening M. de Tressan Bishop of Nantes, Chief Almoner of the Duke of Orleans, performed the Ceremony of Christening in the Chapel of the Palais Royal, Mademoiselle de Beaujolois: The Duke of Chartres was Proxy for the King of Spain as Godfather, and the Dutchess of Orleans for the Queen of Spain as Godmother, and she was named Philip Elizabeth. It is advised from Madrid, that the Countess of Lemos is appointed first Lady of the Bed-Chamber to Mademoiselle de Beaujolois, who it is said will set out from hence for Spain before the End of this Month. The King with his Court continues at Versailles. The Dutchess Dowager of Orleans is in a very bad State of Health. Letters from Cambray advise, that the Marquess de Lede was preparing to return from thence to Spain in a Week or 10 Days.

Windsor, Nov. 13. This Day Charles Duke of Bolton, John Duke of Rutland, and John Duke of Roxburghe, were installed Knights Companions of the most Noble Order of the Garter in the Royal Chapel of St. George, within the Colledge of the Castle of Windsor.

Navy-Office, Nov. 9, 1722.

The Principal Officers and Commissioners of His Majesty's Navy observing in the Comptrolling the Payments of Ships now paying upon the Lists of Arrears, that several Letters of Attorney and other Powers of old Dates, are produced for the receiving Seamens Wages; and it being probable that many of the Parties who executed the same are dead, as well as some to whom the said Letters of Attorney, &c. were made; to prevent therefore for the future, as much as possible, any Abuses His Majesty or His Subjects may be exposed to thereby, or by false Powers, several of which have been detected: These are to give Notice, that no Wages for any Man's Service in His Majesty's Ships will be paid, where the Person does not appear himself, (or the Witnesses to his Letter of Attorney) by any Power but such as shall be witnessed by two or more Commission or Warrant Officers of His Majesty's Ships in which they serve, or by two or more of the Officers of His Majesty's Yards; or by the Mayor, or two or more of the Magistrates of some Corporation; or by the Minister and Churchwardens of the Parish (where the other cannot be had;) or here in London by a Publick Notary, or some of the Officers

or Clerks of the Navy. And all Attornies are to give good and sufficient Proof, that the Persons are living for whom they receive the Money by Virtue of such Powers, or produce new Letters of Attorney from such living Persons, attested in the Manner aforesaid.
