Maje Gracious Sovereign, W E Your Majefty's most dutiful and loyal Sub-jects, in the most humble manner, beg Leave, in this great Conjuncture, to declare to your Majefty our utmost Detestation of that horrid Confpiracy which has been formed, and is still carrying on a-gainst your most facred Perfon and Government, in Favour of a Ponich Presender Favour of a Popish Pretender.

Favour of a Popith Pretender. When we reflect on the ineftimable Happinefs we enjoy under your aufpicious Reign, and confider that the Prefervation of our Civil Rights and Liberties, and the Security of the Protestant Religion, do whol-ly, under God, depend on the Satety of your Ma-jefty's Perfon, and the Succeffion in your Royal Houfe, it raffes in us the higheft Refentment and In-dignation against those ungrateful desperate Traitors, who either through permicious Principles, or private dignation against those ungrateful desperate Trattors, who either through pernicious Principles, or private Discontents and Disappointments, would overturn eur most excellent Constitution in Church and State, involve their Country in Blood and Contustion, and, in open Violation of all Obligations Divine and Hu-mane, subject these Nations to the Revenge and Ty-ranny of a Popish Pretender, over which your Ma-jesty is Rightful and Lawful Sovereign. And as the divine Providence has hitherto preferved your Majefty from fecret Conspiracies and open Rebellion, and crowned your Councils and Arms with Succefs, we doubt not but by the Bl.fling of Almighty God upon your Majefty's Princely Care and Wifdom, the Vigilance of your faithful Miniftry, and upon the ready Affistance of your loyal Subjects, that thefe Ttraiterous Defigns againlt your Majefly will be rendered vain and ineffectual, and the malicious Efforts and wicked Machinations of your Enemies will be turned to their own Confusion.

W E your Majefty's most dutiful and loyal Sub-jects the Provost, Fellows, and Scholars of the College of the Holy and Undivided Trinity, near Dublin, beg Leave to affure your Majefty, that it is with the deepeft Concern we understand, that a dan-gerous Confpiracy hath been formed against your Person and Government in favour of a Pepish Pretender.

And as this wicked Defign hath been imparted to your Majefty by the Powers in Alliance with you, we cannot but lament upon this Occasion, that any Number of your British Subjects should want that Affection to your Person and Government which is sound even in the Hearts of Foreigners.

We hoped that the fignal Infatuation and evil Succefs of the former Devices and Attempts of your Enemies, added to the most facred Engagements of Duty to your Majefly, would have fo well fecured your Government, that Rebellion fhould no more attempt to diffurb your Reign ; but are now forced to reflect with Horror upon the abandoned Condition of those Men, whom no Obligations can bind, nor Experience admonifh.

Your Majesty's most gracious Resolution of steadi-ly adhering to the Constitution in Church and State, for and continuing to make the Laws the Rule and Mea-fure of all your Actions, cannot but be infinitely ac-ceptable to all your Subjects, and is the nobleft Foundation of that just Confidence wherewich you repole your felf upon the Affections of your People, and the Properties of the Division Browiese which and the Protection of the Divine Providence, which has fo often and fo yilibly interpoled in your Favour.
