AN humble Address of the University and King's College of Aberdeen. As also,

An humble Address of the Justices of the Peace for the County of Aberdeen, met at their Quarter Sessions the 31st of October 1722, having been transmitted to the Honourable Archibald Grant, Esq; Knight of the Shire for the County of Aberdeen, has by him been presented to His Majesty, being introduced by his Grace the Duke of Roxburghe, one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State.

Which Addresses His Majesty was pleased to receive very graciously.

Gibraltar, Oct. 31. Captain Scot with five of His Majesty's Ships having been some Days in this Bay, will sail To-Day up the Mediterranean. The Spanish Fleet is gone within the Puntals at Cadiz, in order to be laid up.

Madrid, Nov. 25, N. S. By Letters received from Malaga we learn, that the 23d the Squadron under the Command of Captain Scot passed by that Place ten Days ago with a fair Wind up the Mediterranean. Sentence has been passed upon the Valet de Chambre and the Goldsmith, concerned in a Design to rob and murder Collonel Stanhope His Britannick Majesty's Ambassadour at this Court; condemning them to be publicly whipt through the Streets of Madrid, and afterwards sent to the Gallies for 10 Years. There being but one Witness of their said Design, they could not by the Laws of Spain be punished with more Severity; but had there been two Witnesses of it, they would have been put to Death.

Paris, Dec. 5, N. S. On the 3d Instant the Cardinal du Bois was received a Member of the French Academy by their Assembly: On which Occasion he made a Speech, which was extremely applauded. He was answered in the Name of the Academy, by M. de Fontenelle.
