**T**HE King, since his Return hither from the Escorial, gives great Application to the Dispatch of Business, and keeps the Secretaries of State attending daily. A Council having been held some Days ago at the House of the President of Castile, it was resolved by all the Ministers present, except Don Joseph Patino, that the Chamber of Commerce should be removed back from Cadiz to Seville. This Court having received Advice, that Mademoiselle de Beaujolois being on her Journey hither from Paris, will arrive at Bayone by the 31st Instant, Orders have been renewed for the Officers and others of the Household who are to receive her on the Frontier, to set out from hence the 16th: The King, Queen, and Royal Family, will go as far as Guadalaxara to meet her. On the 12th Instant the Ambassadour of the Republick of Venice made his publick Entry with a very splendid Retinue; the Ambassadour himself was on Horseback, in the Habit of a Venetian Senator. He was followed by a Train of his own Coaches, and others of the foreign Ministers; and being conducted to the Royal Palace by the Major-domo for the Week, had publick Audience of their Catholick Majesties, the Prince and Princess of Asturias, and the Infantes. On the 13th the Envoy of Genoa made his publick Entry in a Coach, with a handsome Retinue, and was in like Manner conducted to an Audience of their Majesties and the Royal Family.

Lisbon, Dec. 17, N. S. Collonel Worley having been detained here till now by contrary Winds, embarked this Day for Barbadoes on board His Britannick Majesty's Ship the Lynn, and the Wind being fair will forthwith proceed on his Voyege thither, with the Adventure an English Mer-

chant-Ship under his Convoy bound likewise for Barbadoes.

Paris, Dec. 26, N. S. Baron Sparre, Minister of the King of Sweden, is arrived here from Stockholm, and will proceed in a short Time to the Court of Great Britain. Letters from Rome of the 8th Instant advise, that the Princess Ursini died there the 4th in the 84th Year of her Age, after a few Days Illness, during which she was frequently visited by the Cardinals Gualtieri and Acquaviva. The same Letters relate, that the Pope was in a very bad State of Health; and that his Distemper was the Dropsy in the Stomach, which his Physicians judged to be incurable.
