If or the Exportation thereof, in manner, as aforefaid; and one third Part of the Monies to be raifed by fuch Sale, fhall be paid to the Kings Majefty, His Heirs and Succeptor

Whereas it is moft evident, that the Continuance of the Trade to the Eaft-Indics, in the fame Manner and Proportions as it hath been for two Years laft paft, muft inevitably be to the great Detriment of this Kingdom, by exhaulting the Treature thereof, and melting down the Coin, and taking away the Labour of the People ; whereby very many of the Manufacturers of this Nation are become excelfively burthenfome and chargeable to their refpective Parifhes, and others are thereby compelled to feek for Employment in foreign Parts : For Remedy whereof, Be it enacted by the King's moft Excellent Majeffy, by and with the Advice and Confent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and Commons in this prefent Parliament affembled, and by the Authority of the fame, That from and after the Twenty ninth Day of September, One thoufand feven hundred and one, all wrought Silks, Bengals and Stuffs, mixed with Silk or Herba, of the Manufacture of Perfia, China, or Eaft-India, and all Callicoes, Painted, Dyed, Printed or Stained there, which are or fhall be imported into this Kingdom, fhall sot be worn, or otherwife ufed within this Kingdom of England, Dominion of Wales, or Town ot Berwick upon Tweed, but under fuch Limitations as are herein after mentioned and expredied.

And for the better effecting the fame, Be it enacted by the Authority aforefaid, That from and after the faid Twenty ninth Day of September, One thoufand feven hundred and one, all fuch wrought Silks, Ben-gals and Stuffs, mixed with Silk or Herba, of the Ma-nufacture of Perfia, China, or Eaft-India, as aforefaid, end all Callicoes, Painted, Dyed, Printed or Staned there, which are or fhall be imported into this King-dom of England, Dominion of Wales, or Town of Berwick upon Tweed, fhall, after Entry there-of, be forthwith carried and put into fuch Ware-houfe or Warehoufes, as fhall be for that purpofe approved of by the Commiffioners of His Maje-fity's Cufforms for the Time being, fo as none of them fhall be taken or carried out thence upon any Account whatfoever, other than in order for Expor-tation, and not until fufficient Security be firft given to the Kings Majefty,His Heirs and Succeffors, (which the faid Commiftioners are hereby required and imthe faid Commissioners are hereby required and im-powered to take) that the fame and every Part therepowered to take) that the name and every rait thete-of fhall be Exported, and not Landed again in any Part of this Kingdom of England, Dominion of Wales, or Town of Berwick upon Tweed; which faid Secu-rities thall be difcharged without any Fee or Reward, upon Certificate returned under the Common Seal of upon Certificate returned under the Common Scal or the Chief Magiftrate, in any Place or Places beyond the Seas, or inder the Hands and Seals of two known English Merchants upon the Place, that fuch Goods were there landed, or upon Proof by credible Per-tons, that fuch Goods were taken by Enemies or pe-cified in the Seas, the Enemiestian and Proof there. tons, that fuch Goods were taken by Enemies or pe-rifhed in the Seas; the Examination and Proof there-bf being left to the Judgment of the faid Commifie-ners: And all fuch of the aforefaid Goods, whether the fame fhall be mixed, fewed, or made up together for Sale, with any other Goods or Materials, or other-wife, which shall be found in any Houfe, Shop or Warehoufe, or other Place whatfoever (other than in fuch Warehoufes as shall be approved of by the faid Commiftioners. as aforefaid) shall be forfeited, and lubiest and liable to be fearched for, and feized, and fubjest and liable to be fearched for, and feized, in like manner as Prohibited and Uncultomed Goods are, by an Act (Intituled, An Act for Preventing Fraudus, and Regulating Abufes in His Majefly's Cuf-soms) made in the Fourteenth Year of the Reign of the Saura Sauraing Lord King Charles the Second our late Sovereign Lord King Charles the Second ; and all fuch Goods to forfeited, as alorefaid, shall, upon Seizure thereof, be carried to the next Cuftomhouse, and after Condemnation, shall be told to the best Advantage for Exportation, at publick Sale by the Candle; the Buyer and Buyers giving Securicy

for the Exportation thereof, in manner, as aforefaid; and one third Part of the Monies to be raifed by fuch Sale, fhall be paid to the Kings Majefty. His Heirs and Succeffors, and the other two third Parts thereof to him, her or them that fhall feize or profecute for the fame; and over and above the Lofs of the faid-Goods, the Perfon or Perfons in whole Cuftody, knowing thereof, the fame fhall be found or feized; or that fhall fell or difpofe thereof to any Perfon or Perfons whatfoever, fhall forfort and lofe the Sum of Two hundred Pounds, one third Part thereof to the Kings Majefty, His Heirs and Succeffors, and the other two third Parts thereof to fuch Perfon or Perfons that fhall fue for the fame, to be recovered by Action of Debt, Bill, Plaint, Suit or Information, in any of His Majefty's Courts of Record at Weftminfter, wherein no Effoign, Protection or Wager of Law thall be allowed, or any more than one Imparlance.

And for Preventing all clandefine Importing or Bringing into this Kingdom of England, Dominion of Wales, or Town of Eerwick upon Tweed, any of the aforefaid Goods hereby Prohibited, or intended to be Prohibited from being worn or uled in England, Be it further enacted by the Authority aforefaid, That if any Perion or Perfons, or Bodies Corporate, from and after the faid Twenty ninth Day of September, One thoufand feven hundred and one, fhall impore or bring into any Port of or in this Kingdom of England, Dominion of Wales, or Town of Berwick up on Tweed, other than the Port of London, any of London, and fhall not make due Entries of fuch Goods fo imported, or brought in, the fame fhall be, and is hereby adjudged, deemed, accounted and taken, to be clandeftune Running thereof, and fuch Perfon or Perfons, or Bodies Corporate fo offending therein, and their Abettors, fhall not only forient and lofe the faid Goods fo clandeftinely Run, as aforefaid, but alfo the Sum of Five hundred Pounds, to be recovered and divided in fuch manner, as atorefaid.

And be it further enacted, That if any Quekkon or Doubt fhall arife where the faid Goods were manufactured, the Proof fhall lie upon the Owner or Owners thereof, and not upon the Profecutor; any Law, Ufage, or Cuftom to the contrary notwithflanding.

And be it further enacted, by the Authority aforefaid, That it any Action, Bill, Plaint, Suit or Information, fhall be commenced or profecured againft any Perfon or Perfons, for any Seizure, or other thing to be made or done, in purfuance or in execution of any thing before in this Act contained, fuch Perfon or Perfons fo fued in any Courr whatfoever, may plead the general Iffue, and give this Act and the fpecial Matter in Evidence, for their Excufe or Julification; and if the Plaintiff or Plaintiffs, or Profecutor or Profecutors, fhall become Nonfuit, or forbear Profecution, or fuffer Diffortinuance, or if a Verdict pafs againft him, her or them, in any fuch Action, Bill, Plaint, Suit or Information, as aforefaid, the Detendant or Detendants fhall have treble Cofts, for which they fhall have the like Remedy, as in any Cafe where Cofts by Law are given to the Defendant.

And for preventing clandeflinely carrying out of the faid Warehoufes, any of the faid Goods hereby prohibited, and by this Act intended for Exportation, as aforefaid : Be it further enacted, by the Authority aforefaid, That the Warehoufe-keeper or Warehoufekeepers, fhall keep one or more Book or Books, wherein he or they fhall fairly Enter or Write down an exact, particular, and true Account of all and every Cheft, Bale and Number of Pieces therein coatained of fuch of the aforefaid Goods only, which fhall be brought into, a d carried out of his or their faid Warehoufe or Warehoufes, and the Days and Times when the fame fhall be fo brought in and carried out; and fhall every Six Months in the Yeat transfit in Writing an exact Account thereof, upon Oath, to the faid Goomilhoners, together with an exact

exact Account how much shall be remaining in his of f their faid Warehouse or Warehouses respectively : And the faid Commissions are hereby impowered and enjoyned, within one Month after the fame shall be transmitted to them, as aforesaid, to appoint one or more Person or Persons to inspect the said Book or Books, Warehouse or Warehouses, and examine the faid: Accounts, and to lay a true Account of the fame before the Parliament, within the firlt Week of every Seilions thereof; and if upon Examination it fhall appear, That any of the aforefaid Goods were car-ried out, unlefs for Exportation, or before (ufficient Securicy given for their Exportation, as aforefaid, That then the Warchoufe-keeper or Warchoufe-keepers fo offending therein, fhall not only forteit and lole the Value of the faid Goods fo carried out, as aforefaid, and be for ever difabled from any publick Employment for the future, but shall also forteit the Sum of Five Hundred Pounds for every fuch Offence, to be recovered and divided in minner, as a. torefaid.

Provided always, and it is hereby enacted, That this Act finall not extend to any Silks, Bengals, Stuffs mixed with Silk or Herba, or painted, dyed, printed or ftained Callicoes manufactured in Perila, China or East-India, which shall have been made up and used in any fort of Apparel or Furniture, before the said Twenty ninth of September, One Thousand seven hundied and one.

Provided always, and be it further enacted, That it fhall and may be Lawful to and for the Proprietor of Proprietors of the faid Goods fo lodged in any Warehoule or Warehoules, as atorefaid, to affix one Lock to every fuch Warchoufe or Warchoufes, the Key of which thall remain in the Cuftody of the faid Proprietor or Proprietors; and that he or they may view, fort or deliver the faid Goods, in Order for Exporfation, as alorefaid, in the prefence of the faid Warehouse-keeper or Warehouse keepers, who is and are hereby obliged, at scalonable times, to give Attendance for that purpole.

Provided allo, and be it enacted by the Authority aforefaid, That every Perfon or Perfons, or Bodies Corporate, who shall on or before the faid Twenty ninth Day of September, One thouland feven hundred and one, import into this Kingdom, Dominion of Wales, or Town of Berwick upon Tweed, any of the Commodities atorefaid, and fhall within the Space of Three Years from fuch Importation, export the fame again, fhall be allowed and paid the feveral During each lower the Exponential threat as fail Duties payable upon the Exportation thereof, as ful-ly as if the fame had been exported within Twelve Months after the Importation thereof.

And be it further enacted, by the Authority afore-faid, That from and after the faid Twenty ninth Day of September, which (hall be in the Year of our Lord, One-thousand feven hundred and one, there fhall be no Customs or Duties whatfoever paid or fe-cured to be paid for any of the fid Goods or Comin the no Cultoms of Dulies whatloever paid of le-cured to be paid for any of the faid Goods or Com-modities, which shall be imported at any time from and after the faid Twenty ninth Day of September, One Thousand seven bundred and one, other than and except the Half Subfidy which is to remain by Law after the Goods are exported; But that all other Cultoms and Duties now chargeable upon or payable for the faid Goods, shall from that time cease and de-termine. termine.
