Paris, Jan. 30. A Courier from Turin arrived here the 27th, with an Account, that at his setting out from thence Madame Royale was so ill that there was little Hope of her Recovery. M. de Bellance, Bishop of Marseilles, is arrived at Court from his Diocess; the King received him with great Marks of Favour, and highly commended him for the good Conduct he observed during the whole Time of the Plague in that City. It is discoursed, that the Duke de Noailles will be permitted to return to Court. A great Number of Dukes and Peers are to meet this Morning in Parliament to receive the Count d'Eglimont in Quality of Provost of this City in the Room of his Father the late M. de Bullion; he is afterwards to be installed at the Chatelet by a President á Mortier and two Councillours of the Great Chamber: At Noon the new Provost gives a Magnificent Entertainment at the Hôtel Bullion.
